**The Great Escape** by Susan Elizabeth Phillips is definitely a love story. But it is not like any other romance novel you've ever read.

Lucy is about to marry the man of every woman's dreams. The perfect gentleman, witty, intelligent, thoughtful, sensitive.

And her wedding dress is about to choke the life right out of her. What to do?

Escape!

Lucy runs from her fairytale wedding and dashes headlong into an adventure she is sure she wants to experience. But as time wears on, she begins to discover things about herself that she has buried deeply and is shocked to come face to face with her real self.

Along with more self understanding comes a realization that her adoptive parents are not perfect and in fact, have made some grave mistakes in their lives that have affected Lucy and the woman she has become.

### Ambulance Service

The Dallesport-Murdock Community Council strongly objects to the change in ambulance service enacted by Skyline Hospital and Mike Madden.

In pamphlets circulated prior to the levy voted to support service, the public was promised 24-hour service. Ambulance service is never a money maker or even a break even venture for a local hospital.

Using a levy to help provide this public service is a trust that promised that those funds will not be used elsewhere. Dallesport used EDA money and the efforts of Dave Sauter as a contractor to build an ambulance building at the request of Mike Madden. At that time, Mike Madden promised the Dallesport Community that Skyline would house and crew an ambulance in Dallesport 24/7, 365 days a year. That building is now being used 14 hours a day to service this part of the County.

We are asking the Skyline Hospital Board of Directors for a full accounting of use of past EMS Levy funds and a balance thereof.

Obviously the public is concerned that levy funds promised to fund ambulance service should be so used.

With the ambulance service so severely cut, we would like to know exactly how those funds are and have been spent.

This is at a time when Skyline is proposed as the anchor Tennant of the Airport Commercial Development.

In summary, we would like an accounting of EMS Levy funds, past and

present, that we were assured both in printed material and in person, to allow us to formulate a new action plan to serve our community.

### Skyline and Providence Collaborate During Difficult Times

To make the best of difficult times in health care, Skyline Hospital and Providence Hood River Memorial Hospital are collaborating in the area of obstetrics for at least the next few months. Skyline Hospital's Birth Center, known for its one-on-one personal care, has experienced a lower-than-usual volume over the past year to the extent that it has been difficult staffing a 24/7 birth center. While Skyline Hospital re-evaluates its financial situation, the physicians in Klickitat and Skamania

counties' primary medical group—NorthShore Medical Group—will continue to offer family centered obstetrics care and see patients at their White Salmon and Stevenson offices; however, they will be temporarily delivering babies at Providence in Hood River.

"We greatly appreciate the excellent support we have received from the Providence OB department. These cooperative efforts are important to assure great care for growing families in the Columbia Gorge," says Dr. Joseph Rinella of NorthShore Medical Group. "In the future, we hope to see the development of a team of OB nurses that can work at both Skyline and Providence so that women can get excellent care at whichever facility is closest to their home and family support."

Ed Freysinger, Chief Executive of Providence Hood River Memorial Hospital concurs. "We're happy to work alongside Skyline Hospital to continue providing a positive birthing experience for patients in our community. In these times of health care reform, health care organizations are coming together to find solutions to find less expensive ways of delivering health care, while maintaining quality."

"Considering our current financial constraints, we're collaborating to make sure that our patients continue to get excellent care, even during difficult times," says Mike Madden CEO of Skyline Hospital. "Skyline Hospital—like most hospitals in the state—is experiencing a substantial downturn in revenues. We pride ourselves on offering personal care, and with severe budget constraints at the moment, we're not able to offer the kind of 24/7 personal care in our Birth Center that our patients have come to expect."

The Birth Center is not the only department at Skyline that is affected, in fact, Skyline Hospital has instituted some budget cutting measures across the board—such as reducing hours of all non-direct patient-care employees by one-fifth, reducing employee meals and uniform allowances, and curtailing obstetrics until further notice.

"Every hospital in the country is undergoing difficult times," adds Mr. Madden. "It makes sense that we, as neighbors, work together to figure out how to best serve the residents of the Gorge."

## **Lyle School Board cuts budget 23 percent, adds back .3 FTE for interim superintendent**

The Lyle School Board passed a budget that anticipates \$777,237 less revenue and \$825,032 less spending for the 2012-13 school year. The 23 percent cut in expenditures was described by Tim Merlino as “a huge cut for a small school district.” But it is just the beginning of action that will hopefully right the school’s sinking ship and secure its future.

Merlino is the administrator assigned by ESD112 to advise the school on action that would immediately balance the budget and then work to improve the overall situation at the school. The cut in revenue and budget is predicated on an expected enrollment of 220 students, a loss of 75 from the current year. Teaching staff will be reduced to 7.2 full-time equivalent (FTE) at the middle and high schools and 4 FTE at the elementary school. Secretarial staff will be reduced by one position which is accounted for through retirement.

Last month it was reported that Superintendent Martin Huffman would

leave after taking a position at Toledo High School. Huffman made that official with his resignation at Thursday night’s school board meeting. The initial plan was to reduce administration to one position, but the Board backed off that a little, deciding to fund a .3 FTE interim administrator. Next spring the board will revisit that position and perhaps make it permanent. The Board also concluded they could not find a volunteer athletic director, so they assigned a \$5,000 stipend to that position. They also created a \$5,000 stipend for a “lead teacher” to be a person in charge at Dallesport School in the absence of an administrator.

The reduction in revenues comes mainly from loss of state general purpose funds, amounting to almost \$600,000. Those funds are based on enrollment, which is driving the budget reduction, along with the need to correct a negative fund balance.

According to Merlino, the state requirement is a minimum of 10.2 teaching FTE for schools the size of Lyle. That number was determined to be too low for the natural flow of classes and classroom management at the two campuses, so the Board settled on 11.2 FTE. That is a cut in 5.5 FTE from their certified, or teaching employees. They also cut four paraprofessionals, one bus driver and some reduction in grounds and maintenance.

In other business, the levy issue arose again. The Board had authorized replacement maintenance and operation levy asking of \$427,000 then were advised it would be an illegal election. They tried to remove it from the ballot, but missed the deadline and ballots were already printed and mailed to military voters. In Thursday’s meeting, Tom Jellum moved and Jeff Eiesland seconded a motion to authorize legal action to stop tabulation of the levy election or stop collection of dollars should it pass. The topic drew much discussion from the audience. Board chair Penny McAnally said “taxpayers are already calling OSPI (Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction) and complaining.” McAnally expressed concern that the school could be sued. The Board’s general counsel, Jeanie Tolcacher said that the Attorney General and the Supreme Court have determined that a third election would be illegal. McAnally called for a vote and all voted yes with Tria Bullard abstaining.

The board was also presented notification that the petition for redistricting the Lyle School District with three districts and two at-large members was certified by the Klickitat County Auditor. There were 384 valid signatures on the petition out of a total of 431. The requirement to have the measure on the fall ballot was 372 valid signatures. ESD112 is currently working on the wording that will be submitted for the ballot.

## ***IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE CURRENT SCHOOL LEVY ELECTION***

Dear Lyle School District Residents:

On behalf of the Lyle School District Board of Directors, I am writing this letter to provide important information about the circumstances surrounding the current school levy election.

At its May 2012 meeting, the Board adopted a resolution to ask voters to approve a \$427,000 maintenance and operations levy. Shortly after the resolution was approved, the Board was informed by legal counsel and the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) that running a levy election three times in one calendar year was not legal. School districts in Washington State can only place a levy on the ballot twice in one year. Two previous elections failed to gain voter approval this year.

Based on this new information, on June 21, 2012, the Board rescinded the resolution to place the ballot measure before voters.

The district immediately notified Klickitat County that the levy resolution had been rescinded. However, the due date for printing and mailing the ballots had already passed and the County is unable to legally remove the levy election from the ballot. Because the district does not wish to risk involvement in an illegal levy election, the Lyle School Board authorized the district's attorney to take legal action to enjoin the election. This will give the County the authority it needs to stop the reporting of the election results and the resulting tax assessment if the levy were to be approved.

If you are a registered voter and have already received your ballot, the Board believes it's important for you to fully understand the developments related to this election and the subsequent actions being taken by the Board and the district.
