County-Wide Ambulance to Serve the Community More Effectively and Efficiently

The Boards of Commissioners of the two Hospital Districts in Klickitat County have entered into a contract with Hadassah Management Systems (HMS) to manage the ambulance services of the two entities. HMS is a local community based company that has been providing EMS management in eastern Klickitat County since February 2010. Both hospitals have spent many years and significant financial resources to build a strong Emergency Medical System (EMS) in the county. The level of training, medical expertise and equipment rivals any rural EMS system in the state.

The time has come to wean the service from the hospitals and to allow the beneficiaries of this service to govern and to direct this vital county resource. Critical Access Hospitals that operate ambulance services are reimbursed at about 40% of total charges, insuring no chance of a positive bottom line. With an independent or municipal operator, the reimbursement goes up to at least 45% of charges and, together with an EMS levy, could operate without the current significant subsidies from the hospital districts.

Effective August 26, 2012, the ambulance services of both Klickitat Valley Health and Skyline Hospital will combine operations and HMS will take over day to day operation of both services. While the rolling stock and all capital equipment will remain owned and maintained by each hospital, the

employees and operation of the ambulance service will be managed by HMS. All ambulances will display the logos of the three entities and will be operated by the same staff. There will be ambulances based and staffed 24/7 in Goldendale, White Salmon and Dallesport with a fourth standby crew and ambulance in Goldendale. We believe this level of service will meet the needs of the residents of the two hospital districts.

In many states, the responsibility for emergency medical services rests with the various counties and municipalities. In rural Washington, hospitals stepped up to provide those services where no ambulance services existed. As training and equipment requirements increased, along with increasing costs associated with ever increasing new requirements imposed by the government, the small hospitals could no longer afford the extra costs of running ambulance services. In recent years, reimbursements for all services have continually been reduced as the State and Federal governments shave costs. The future survival of rural hospitals depends on the hospitals returning to providing required services and maintaining access to that care for the citizens they serve.

To insure the future of this level of Emergency Medical Service, the two District Boards will ask the Klickitat County Commissioners to establish a county wide EMS district, with its own elected board, to take over the operation

of the ambulance service. The County Commissioners can establish this district by a majority vote of the commission. Upon the establishment of an EMS district, the district becomes a junior taxing district and can assess levies to help defray the cost of operation.

The Skyline Hospital district currently receives an EMS levy of approximately 28 cents per \$1,000 that has been used to offset some of the losses of operating the service. Skyline Hospital has been subsidizing the ambulance service loss to the tune of \$450,000 per year. These levy dollars will continue to be used strictly for EMS services. Upon establishment of the EMS district, the two hospital districts will transfer all assets of the ambulance services to the EMS district. This move will enable the hospital districts to use their financial assets to continue to provide hospital and physician services to their communities and EMS district to use its resources to provide pre-hospital emergency care.

This level of service meets the needs of the residents of both hospital district. Skyline CEO and board members will be attending many of the local community council meetings in September to discuss this topic.

David Rosenfelt has written a delightful series of mysteries featuring reluctant lawyer Andy Carpenter. Andy still practices law but is picky about the cases he takes on, much preferring his first love, the rescue shelter for golden retrievers that he and a former client have set up using funds from winning a lawsuit for wrongful conviction and a prison term for this client. The settlement they received was more than enough to set them both up for life so this allows Andy leeway in choosing if he wants to do lawyerly things or not.

In "Leader of The Pack", a case Andy lost years before returns to haunt him and he reluctantly picks up the reins and prepares to go into battle. His client, Joey Desimone, is serving life in prison for a murder that Andy is sure he did not commit. When irregularities in the original case come to light, Andy sees his chance to get justice for his ill-fated client, who he has been regularly visiting in prison for six years out of guilt for not doing a better job.

What follows is a classic whodunit, with many twists and turns involving the Mob, the FBI, militia groups in Montana and Tara, Andy's beloved golden, who keeps him balanced while chasing his own tail trying to follow the many ins and outs of this bizarre case.

This author is a genuinely witty writer, whose classic one liner humor is right up my alley. He crafts a masterful mystery story that is fun to follow and still manages to surprise you at the end. A good read on any day.
