Public Notice

The Postal Service will hold a meeting to answer questions and provide additional information about POST Plan. At the meeting, local management will share the results of the survey and answer questions.

Although survey result will be know and shared, the Postal Service will not make a final decision regarding this office until after the public meeting.

This will enable the Postal Service to obtain all community input and opinions, from both the surveys and the meeting before making a final decision.

Below are the options that the Postal Service is considering. If you did not receive a survey and would like to fill one out, surveys are available at the Post Office counter.

- 1. Keep the office open, based on actual office workload. In the case of Dallesport PO, hours would be reduced from 8 hours each weekday to 6 hours each weekday. Current Saturday hours would not change as a result of POST Plan and access to your delivery receptacles will not be impacted by POST Plan.
- 2. Conduct a discontinuance study for the office and offer roadside mailbox delivery. Retail and delivery service would be provided through a rural carrier. Mail delivery points will be established and customers can purchase most postal services through the carrier or other access points.
- 3. Conduct a discontinuance study for the office and find a suitable alternative location operated by a contractor, usually at a local business. When businesses are found that meet the criteria, these establishments are contracted through the U.S. Postal Service and offer stamps and flat rate products with service hours generally more expansive than what the local Post Office will be able to offer.
- 4. Conduct a discontinuance study for the office and provide P.O. Box service via another nearby Post Office and relocate P.O. Box delivery to that Post Office.

Book Review by Judy Bane

I love finding a new author who writes books that I can't put down. "A Killing In The Hills" by Julia Keller had me captivated from the start.

Set in a very small town in West Virginia, a shocking triple murder of three old men in a crowded diner in broad daylight leaves the county reeling in the aftermath. It happened so quickly that no one could identify the shooter, who got clean away. Even more puzzling is why anyone would kill these men. The motive is a puzzle.

The prosecuting attorney is a woman who grew up in the area and survived a horrendous childhood. She married, moved away, became a lawyer and after a divorce, came back to her hometown hoping to make a difference. She wants to improve conditions in these poverty stricken areas where the joke is "What are West Virginia's two main exports?" The answer is coal and young people.

The long time sheriff and the prosecuting attorney have known each other most of their lives and now must work together to solve this puzzling crime. The story weaves around personal issues between them and other locals as the author builds the suspense of a well told mystery. Old and new secrets are unearthed along the way.

The only disappointment I had when reading this book was about halfway through, when I checked the author blurb on the back flap to see what other novels she has written so I could order them and I discovered that this is her first book. I will anxiously await anything this author writes.

Private Timberlands Remain Closed To Public With No Rain In Sight

As of Sept. 14, Hancock Forest Management, Stevenson Land Company, Broughton Lumber Company, Kreps Ranch, LLC, Kreps Family, LLC, Longview Timberlands LLC, International Forestry Consultants, Inc, and Western Pacific Timber, LLC, are continuing closure of their property and roads to all public entry in Klickitat, Yakima, and Skamania counties.

Stevenson Land Company and Longview Timberlands lands in Hood River and Wasco counties in Oregon are also closed.

"This action continues to be necessary because of the extremely dry conditions, high fire danger, and major fires that have occurred, said Hancock Forest Management Area Manager Wayne Vinyard.

Washington Department of Natural Resources maintains the Industrial Fire Precaution Level at IFPL 3.

These properties will remain closed to all public entry until significant rain reduces the fire danger to IFPL 1.

According to Vinyard, most entry points to the various properties are posted and security patrols have been assigned to strictly enforce the closure.

License Fees to Increase

Several fees related to driver and vehicle licensing charged by the Department of Licensing (DOL) will **increase on Oct.**1. The fee increases were passed by the 2012 State Legislature.

Fees related to driver licensing increasing Oct. 1 include:

- Driver license fee (original and renewal)—\$25 (\$5/year), \$45 (\$9/year).
- CDL fee (original and renewal)—\$61 (\$12.20/year), \$85 (\$17/year).
- Driver instruction permit (original and renewal)—\$20, \$25.
- Driver license application / exam —\$20, \$35.
- DUI hearing (for administrative suspension)—\$200, \$375.
