Dallesport Water District News:

Clerk Change: DWD welcomes Summer Beeks of Dallesport as our new District Clerk. Summer was selected from 30 applicants and has had significant experience with government agencies, and customer service.

DWD wishes to Publically Thank Cheryl Dehart for the service she has provide to this District and our customers. Cheryl leaves the District to join her fiancé in management their new construction business.

Thanks you Cheryl, we wish you, Mike and New Beginnings Concrete the very best.

Reservoir#2 Status: The Reservoir is anticipated to be onsite the first week in March. Completion of the new 218,000 gallon Reservoir is expected by mid-April. Sub contractor, Summit Excavation has completed the piping and pressure testing under the Reservoir installed the base pad, completed compaction testing. Shearer and Associates have completed the foundation concrete and testing. The floor will be poured in place once the tank arrives.

Booster Pump Station/Filtration System Status: The final corrections are in the Drafters hands and we should have a set of prints ready to go to State Department of Health shortly. Currently the target for bidding is Mid April with a 180 day construction timeframe. The design currently contains the long awaited

iron/manganese filtration system to remove the sediment problem from our water supply.

CGRA Project Update: Columbia Gorge Regional Airport is planning on bidding the new Airport Industrial Park this spring with summer construction. Their work includes a new DWD 12" Distribution Main from the new BPS along the south side of 6th Ave and the East side of Dallesport Road to 3rd Ave. A transmission main from the DWD acquired Airport Well to A street will be included as a bid option

Murdock/CDBG – The Murdock Community Development Block Grant application was submitted to the Klickitat County Commissioners for adoption on the 29th of January and submitted to CDBG the following day. The grant application if selected would include a New Well Source, Reservoir and Complete Distribution/Fire suppression for the Murdock area. The 100% Grant Project can be applied for due to the determination of low/moderate income status of the Murdock area in a 2011 survey. The Decision by CDBG will be in May 2013. The Klickitat County Commissioners have pledged to provide the 10% match monies for the project if selected. DOH has committed to a \$24,000 planning grant for the Murdock area.

Flushing- Dallesport Water System was flushed on Wednesday February 6th, following dirty water complaints received on the evening of February 5th. The area in question along with 3rd and 6th Avenues showed significantly more discoloration than the remaining system. 8 individuals spoke directly with the Manager during flushing operations and all complemented DWD on the efforts to install the new filtration system during the upcoming project. An important aspect to remind our customers is that even during times of high sedimentation DWD has not had a Bacteriological violation in over 7 years. If you should experience discolored water please open either an outside faucet or the cold water in the bath tub and allow to flow for approximately 15 minutes. If it does not clear by that time please do not hesitate to call the Manager at 541-980-6756

Have I said before that I absolutely love finding a new author? Well, I'm saying it again. I just finished "A Walk In The Park" by Jill Mansell. To say I was pleasantly surprised is a severe understatement. What a fun book!

Set in modern England, this is a little gem of a novel that offers a quirky view of how we relate to each other in our daily life.

Lara Carson left her family and boyfriend eighteen years ago without a word to anybody. She returns to her hometown of Bath for her father's funeral and discovers that he has left her the family home. She decides to stay and build a life here in the town she loved as a child. Her old boyfriend Flynn gets involved in her life again, even though she is determined that they will not get back together. The gossip mill swings into high action. As secrets pile up on secrets, the brand new life Lara is searching for becomes ever more elusive.

With a diverse cast of characters ranging from an eccentric Aunt, a best friend who left her groom at the altar (with good reason), an ex-husband that is still a good friend and a daughter on the verge of adulthood, this tangled little knot of people come out all right in the end, despite the numerous twists and turns in the road.

Phone And Internet Assistance Available To Low Income Consumers

CenturyLink, Inc. is spreading the word about low-income assistance programs that help qualifying consumers obtain reduced-price voice and high-speed Internet services.

CenturyLink participates in a government benefit program called Lifeline to make residential telephone service more affordable to eligible low-income individuals and families. Qualifying consumers are those who meet eligibility standards defined by the Federal Communications Commission and state public service and utilities commissions. Residents who live on federally recognized tribal lands may qualify for additional tribal benefits if they participate in certain additional federal eligibility programs. The Lifeline discount is available for only one telephone line per household, which can be either a wireline or wireless telephone. To find out more about the Lifeline program, visit the government website at www.lifeline.gov. Individuals living in a CenturyLink service area should call 1-800-366-8201 or visit www.centurylink.com/lifeline to inquire about Lifeline eligibility.

In addition to reduced-price phone service, CenturyLink offers discounted high-speed Internet service starting at \$9.95 per month, plus applicable taxes and fees, to eligible consumers in markets where Internet service is available. The program, known as CenturyLink Internet Basics, uses the same income and program eligibility criteria as the Lifeline and Tribal Link-Up programs and provides access up to 1.5 Mbps downstream capability. Higher bandwidth services, where available, are offered at a comparable discount. A qualifying individual may enroll in this service plan once for a 12-month term, which may be extended on a month-to-month basis.

CenturyLink is also offering program participants an Internet-ready netbook computer for \$150, plus taxes, shipping and handling.

In addition, CenturyLink is arranging basic computer education and technology training at no cost. The classes are being offered through community groups and senior centers, as well as schools, libraries, and other state and local institutions, in more than 100 markets throughout the country.

In 1973 he, his parents, and his siblings Jodi, Lori, and Dennis moved to Dallesport.

He played football and basketball in high school, but his passion was baseball. He graduated from Lyle High School in 1979. He went on to spend most of his time coaching baseball. He coached little league and many other teams. He became co-head baseball coach with

Scott Myers at Lyle High School from 1993-2009. During that tenure he became surrogate father/uncle and lifetime coach to many. He was an avid Giants and Raiders fan. Jeff was also involved in the Republican Party, Klickitat County ESD Board, Dallesport Fire Department, Dallesport Town Council, and the Lyle School Board.

He loved golfing, slow-pitch softball, and Burgerville. He was an excellent Trivia player. He prided himself on knowing a little bit about a lot of things. He was also at the center of family campouts every year. He will be remembered for his quick wit and one liners.

He is survived by his parents Robert and Delores, his siblings Jodi McMurrin (Tim), Lori J. Clark (Jeff), and Dennis Eiesland (Kandi Billups), 10 nieces and nephews, five great nieces and nephews, his grandmother Emma Eiesland, and many, many, many aunts, uncles, and cousins.

Charles Loyd (Dick) McNabb was born and lived most of his life in Lyle, but currently lived in Battle Ground, with his daughter and son-in-law. He passed away Sunday, Jan. 27, in Vancouver.

Born June 14, 1933, to Lloyd and Stella McNabb, Dick went to Balch and Lyle schools and then served in the armed forces immediately after graduating from Lyle High School.

Returning home from Korea 16 months later, Dick went to work at a local grocery store, then with the Klickitat County Road Department and retired at 49 years of age with the Washington State Department of Transportation.

After retiring, he went to work for Bingen City Police as a patrolman and later worked in security at Grand Teton National Park.

Dick married Tamara Sexton (1940-1988) in 1962 and they had two children, Mike (1959-1986) and Kathy.

During his lifetime, Dick was also involved in the community as an Emergency Medical Technician, reserve deputy with the Klickitat County Sheriff's Office and volunteer fireman.

He was an avid hunter and fisherman and loved the outdoors. Hunting trips took Dick into several states where he

hunted many different kinds of big game.

Dick is survived by his daughter Kathy and son-in-law Jeff, grandchildren Jacob and Miraya, grandson-in-law Riley, and step-grandchildren, Sarah, Levi, Kate and Noah.

A funeral service was held at 2 p.m., Feb. 1, at Gardner Funeral Home in White Salmon.

Ferrellgas to site at Dallesport

On Jan. 22, the Port of [Klickitat](#) and Ferrellgas signed a ground lease for the former Empire Gas site in the Port's [Dallesport](#) Industrial Park. Just over one acre in size, the property will be initially used to store 30,000 gallons of liquid propane gas (LPG). Though the agreement does not preclude additional storage facilities, any expansion would be subject to approval of the [Klickitat County](#) Board of Adjustment.

"Many of our constituents use propane to cook, heat their homes, dry their clothes, or run their generators so it's important to have this resource in our community," remarked Port Commissioner Bill Schmitt. "We are pleased to welcome Ferrellgas to [Dallesport](#) and [Klickitat County](#)."

Ferrellgas continues a long history of LPG providers that have located at the [Dallesport](#) Industrial Park over the last two decades. Prior tenants include Columbia Propane, All Star Gas (f.k.a. Empire Gas), and most recently, AmeriGas.

"The Port is sensitive to anxiety regarding a propane operation at the industrial park," said Marc Thornsbury, the Port's Executive Director. "Many of these concerns are spawned by the fire that occurred at the AmeriGas facility in 2005. However, there have been no incidents since and we believe that, given the risks inherent with LPG storage, an industrial park is the best place for it rather than near a school or residential area."

Before agreeing to execute a lease, the Port required Ferrellgas to obtain a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) from [Klickitat County](#) and to make contact with the local fire department ([Klickitat County](#) Fire District No. 6). The conditions of the CUP require Ferrellgas to, among other things, perform regular site inspections, maintain an on-site health and safety plan, provide safety training for its employees, and monitor the site for evidence of unauthorized entry.
