NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Declaring Intent to Create an Emergency Medical Service District

Notice is hereby given that the Board of County Commissioners will hold public hearings at 2:45 PM and 6:30 PM on **Tuesday, April 2, 2013** in the Commissioner's Meeting Room, 205 S. Columbus, Room 101, **Goldendale, WA 98620** AND at 6:30 PM on **Wednesday, April 3, 2013** in the Senior Services Banquet Hall, Pioneer Center Building, 501 N.E. Washington Street, **White Salmon** to hear and consider public comment on a proposal to create a County-wide emergency medical service district.

Emergency medical services include both basic life support (provided by emergency medical technicians) and advanced life support (provided by paramedics). Emergency medical services (EMS) have been provided in the past in Klickitat County under different programs and by different entities such as public hospital districts and fire protection districts.

Following the hearings Commissioners may determine that, if an emergency medical service district is created, the boundaries of such district may encompass all or portion of the County

No action to create an emergency medical service district will be taken at the public hearings. Any such action will be considered at a later, regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners.

Book Review by Judy Bane "Insane City"

Dave Barry is one of the best comic writers I have ever read. He never disappoints. His latest fiction title just proves my point. It is called Insane City and it is set in...where else..Miami, Florida. Dave's home stompin' ground.

A large, very complicated, very expensive wedding has been planned, to the last teeny tiny detail, for the daughter of a billionaire to her boyfriend, the lesser mortal in this equation. He is a pretty simple guy, hasn't made much of himself since college but basically a solid fella. They met in Washington D.C., where she is a fast track big ambition lawyer with a bright future and he is employed for a company who uses phony Tweets to promote products that need a boost, like forklifts, energy bars and douche. Yep. It's not a real high powered job.

Unexpectedly, she falls in love with him, loser job and all and of course, she is beautiful, rich and smart. So what's not to love? The grandest wedding in all the land is planned with the urgency of D-Day. All that is required of him is to show up with his tux, his best man and the ring. No sweat. Right?

No. Not right. Not right at all. The groom and his groom posse fly in to Miami and immediately get involved in all kinds of things they have no control over. Like the Haitian refugees that wash up on the beach outside the hotel right in front of the groom, who was taking a walk to escape some of the madness surrounding the wedding preparations. He stashes them in his room because if they are turned over to immigration, they will be deported back to Haiti, where they have been starving and homeless. Numerous hi-jinks ensue on behalf of the Haitians and their plight.

Meanwhile, the groom's suitcase has been misplaced at a bar somewhere in South Beach, which is where the groom and posse mistakenly ended up after deplaning, due to a language barrier between them and their Rastafarian cab driver. It contains his tux and the all important, one of a kind, made especially for the bride from her families heirloom jewelry ring. Oops. Somehow it gets left at a wild life park where the orangutan manages to drag it into his cage and open it. He was abused by men but loves women and immediately defaces the tux

when he smells the male aroma. But the ring box smells of a beautiful woman and he keeps that gripped tightly in his huge hand. Numerous hi-jinks ensue again in the attempts to retrieve the ring.

This rollicking story is heavy on rather broad, juvenile humor, which is what I dearly love about Dave Barry. Follow along as this story crashes its way to the hilarious conclusion, in which many, many strange threads are tied off neatly.

Check your property tax statements carefully

Real and personal property tax statements were mailed the end of February. If you have not yet received your statement, please contact our office at 773-4664, 493-6090, or (800) 766-5403.

All taxpayers should check the statements closely. If you have had a Head of Family, Senior, or any other type of exemption in the past and feel you should still be entitled to that exemption but do not see it reflected on your statement, please contact the Assessor's office directly at 773-3715 or (800) 764-2235.

If you have property whose total assessed value is less than \$500, you may be entitled to an exemption on that

property. Again, please contact the Assessor's office directly if this pertains to you.

If you have an appeal on file with the Board of Equalization and have not received a signed "Assessment Roll Corrections Agreed to by the Taxpayer" form from the Assessor's office and/or have not filed the Corrections form with the Board of Equalization (BOE), please be aware that the form must be filed with the BOE prior to April 30 or you will need to pay at least the first half of the taxes currently due to ensure that you do not incur interest or penalty. If, due to timing, you have paid the first half of the current taxes due and the Corrections form is filed with the BOE subsequent to that payment, your taxes will be recalculated for the second half tax due and a new statement will be sent to you. Website has tax, payment, and value information available 24 hours a day.

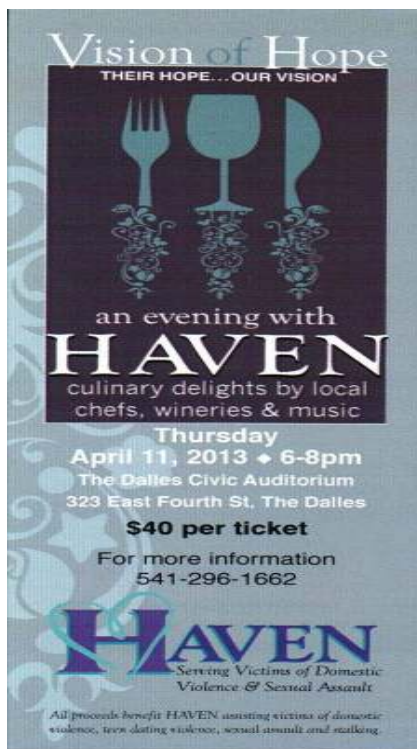
