Columbia Hills' Trail Days May 4th., May 11th., and May 18th.

Visitors are invited to enjoy some guided experiences in the diverse landscape of Columbia Hills State Park. Seeking to replace the 7 year running of the Wagons and Wildflowers event with a more sustainable program, staff at the park has put together a series of tours to highlight some of the park's gems.

On **May 4th** please join Department of Natural Resource staff for a guided walk featuring some peak blooms of the native wildflowers in the Dalles Mountain Ranch portion of the park. Space is limited to about 15 hikers and the will begin at the ranch building cluster located on the Dalles Mountain Road about 3.4 miles up from SR 14. Bring a wildflower book if you have one. If it works out we may get a wildlife biologist to join us and help us ID the birds and critters that call the hills home.

On **May 11th**, Washington State Parks' Interpretive Program Manager, Ryan

Karlson, will lead a hike around Horsethief Butte entitled, "Floods and More Floods: Exploring the Ice Age History of Horsethief Butte." Ryan brings a fantastic background in park interpretation and the Ice Age Floods. Ryan will meet participants at the Horsethief Butte Trail head at 10 a.m. Space is limited to about 15.

On **May 18th**, Craig Holstine, a historian for Washington State and author and researcher of the historic district nomination for the Dalles Mountain Ranch will accompany participants on a riding trailer tour of the Ranch's historic district visiting some of the homestead sites in the park and learning about the various homestead acts and those who sought to capitalize on the federal government's bet against their filing fee that they couldn't settle on a piece of land and live on it for long enough to claim the property. Space is limited to about 9 and participants will meet at the

ranch cluster on Dalles Mountain Road, 3.4 miles up from SR 14. The trailer has wood bench seats so a small stadium type cushion or pad is something to consider.

The tours are free with your annual Discover Pass or with your daily parking permit. Passes and permits can be purchased ahead of time where ever Washington hunting and fishing licenses are sold, at the park, or on line at WWW.discoverpass.wa.gov. All tours are scheduled for 10 a.m. and reservation numbers are limited to those listed above. Call Maryhill State Park at 509-773-5007 to reserve your space. If we experience high responses we will schedule a 2nd iteration of each of the offered events on that same day at 12:30 p.m. Weather should be nice so bring a camera, water, sunscreen, watch for ticks and it wouldn't hurt to pack a snack.

Book Review

"Suspect"

Robert Crais is a best selling crime fiction author who is based in L.A. He is a magnificent author who writes well crafted, thoughtful stories that keep your attention.

His latest is the best I have read so far. It's called "Suspect".

An L.A. policeman is involved in a fire fight where his partner is killed and he is badly shot up. He fights to recuperate and come back to the force rather than take the medical retirement he is offered. His injuries are severe enough that he can't go back to his old job so he ends up signing up for the Canine Patrol. He must be trained in the handling of his dog, much as the dog is trained, also. His Post Traumatic Stress is severe enough that the old, crusty instructor for the Canine Patrol is doubtful of his ability to do this job. He fights to prove himself to everyone involved.

When it comes time for him to be assigned a dog, he ends up with Maggie, a bomb detection dog who was on duty in Afghanistan when her handler was killed, and she was wounded. She also has Post Traumatic Stress and the instructor has major doubts about them as a team. The story unfolds around the budding relationship between the dog and her new handler.

This was an absolutely fascinating look at the world of Post Traumatic Stress and it's aftermath. Some of the chapters are told in Maggie's thoughts and it was a revelation to me to be inside her head, to hear her thoughts and follow her logic. The author has done a terrific job of research in developing this story.

The wounded cop is obsessed with finding out who killed his partner and shot him up so badly. While he is supposed to be getting trained with his new "partner", he is also following up on leads to the case and realizing that there was a major cover-up of the whole incident. As he chases down clue after clue, more and more astounding facts come to life until the final, explosive ending. He and Maggie prove they are a team to make the Canine Patrol proud.

I enjoyed this book so much. You should give it a chance; I think you will fall in love with Maggie as much as I did.

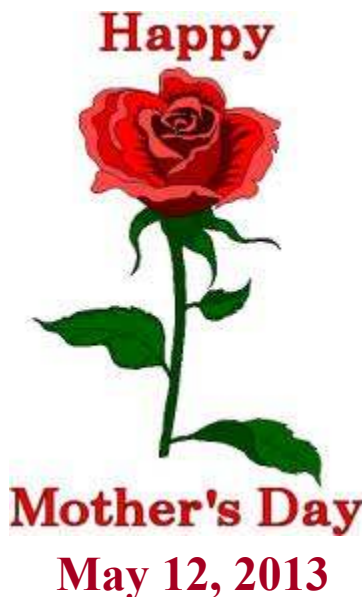
Picture Boards

Wasco County Pioneers Association has collected one of the greatest treasure troves of photographic history archives in the State of Oregon. MaryAnn Campbell, director of research services for the Oregon Historical Society, has stated it is the best photo collection of any community in Oregon.

There are 394 picture boards with 9,110 photos on them. The picture boards are now stored at the Columbia Gorge Discovery Center and Wasco County History Museum, who have scanned and electronically archived these many "one-of-a-kind" photographs of the history of Wasco county. Parents and Guardians of Lyle School 7th and 8th Grade Students-- Here is Great Opportunity for Child's Future

College or Vocational School may seem a long way off to you and your middle school student. There are many decisions to be made as your student matures and starts thinking about their future (and they will!).

Washington State has a unique program to ensure that all Washington High School graduates can go to college regardless of income or circumstances. It's called "College Bound Scholarship". The program requires parent's of students that meet the income guidelines to fill out a simple one page sheet while the student is 7th or 8th grade. (After that it is too late.) Students also pledge to:

*Graduate from a Washington State High School or home school with 2.0 or higher GPA

* Demonstrate good citizenship and stay crime free (ie. no felonies!).

* Submit the FAFSA(Federal Financial Aid) form when they are in their senior year.

*Apply and be accepted to a Washington State College or Voc School from the eligible list!

A one page application, income guidelines, and additional information, is being sent home to all 7th and 8th grade students after spring break. The application is also available in the school offices and on-line; www.collegebound.wa.gov. There is assistance at the school to help fill this out if requested. Over one third of this year's graduating Lyle seniors will be making use of this scholarship that they signed up for in middle school, as well as hundreds across the state. Many students are inspired to stay in school and motivated to keep their grades up knowing that they will have this scholarship when they graduate. **The deadline for 7th and 8th graders in 2013, is June 30th.** Let's give every Lyle School student the support they need to succeed!
