## **New Industrial Development Taking Shape In Dallesport**

Economic development just picked up the pace at the [Dallesport](#) Airport. Tapani Inc. construction, of Battleground, began moving dirt at the industrial development site along the south edge of the airport and expects to soon have sites leveled and utilities in place for 17 lots. Depending on funding, construction of the first building should begin in a few months.

Development of the site is the first step of a larger plan that could provide jobs, housing and recreation to the [Dallesport](#) area.

"We are willing to make the investment," says [Klickitat County](#) Commissioner Dave Sauter, referring to the county and the airport which is jointly owned by the City of The Dalles and [Klickitat County](#). "I'm a huge advocate for infrastructure investment. My hope is if we can move some development east [along the river] to benefit more of the county," says Sauter.

The plan is to develop about 30 acres into lots of varying size and build a "flex" building for the first tenants on lot number three, a 2.46 acre lot. The idea of the flex building is to house one or more tenants with multiple tenants being ideal and allowing them to share some expenses. Buildings on future sites will be done by the tenants to meet their needs. The types of businesses they are looking for are high tech, aviation related businesses.

The flex building is planned to cover about 12,000 square feet. The airport has \$1.25 million planned for the building, \$1 million of which is from a Community Economic Revitalization Board (CERB) grant from Washington State. Sauter said he was meeting with CERB this week to discuss a change in the tenant they expect to have for the building. The outcome of that meeting could alter plans, but the site development is already funded and will proceed as planned.

"The UAV (unmanned air vehicle) businesses are big in the [Gorge](#) area," says Rolf Anderson, with [Gorge](#) Aviation Services who manage the airport. "The [Gorge](#) is providing suppliers for the high tech industries, like [Insitu](#). The same technology also could be used for the agricultural industry. We are hoping to be part of that," says Anderson.

Sauter points out that the type of industry that is being courted is complementary to the [Economic Development](#) in the area. The goal is not to compete with the [Klickitat County](#) Port, which deals with heavy industry, nor with the other communities in the area. The communities and ports are working together, promoting each other, says Sauter. They have linked internet sites and work together on promotional materials and trips. "I'm okay if we can help bring businesses to The Dalles," says Sauter. "If it helps them, it helps us."

There are seven lots being developed around the interior of the site, south of the airport hangers and along a decommissioned runway. Those lots have airport access, which is needed for some of the prospective tenants. Nine more lots are between the interior lots and [Dallesport](#) Road. Those lots will be accessed by a road that will be built and paved by the middle of May. At the southeast end of the site is lot 17, a 7.95 acre lot that will also have airport access. The road through the site will end at lot 17. Each lot will have electricity, water, sewer, telephone lines and internet conduit installed by May. Even gas lines are being put in place for the possibility of gas becoming available in the area. If all goes as planned, there is plenty of area for continued expansion.

Looming in the future is Sundoons development, a planned 18 hole golf course with associated condominium or housing developments. The proposed

site is on private property, east of the airport. Part of the golf course would be on airport property. That project is still alive and would be another key piece of the grand picture of [Economic Development](#) for the area.

There is another piece that Sauter says is also necessary, and that is educational facilities.

"We are also working with the Mid Columbia [Economic Development](#) District (MCEDD)," says Sauter. "Job force training is critical to what we are doing. We are trying to push for a regional higher education facility. We see it [lack of training support] as a detriment to growth. These types of jobs need highly trained people," says Sauter. He foresees that the University of Washington, University of Oregon, WSU and OSU will all have some kind of presence in the area, either satellite campuses or electronic. He also sees a role for Columbia [Gorge](#) Community College, much as in the way CGCC has provided training to support the wind energy industry. MCEDD links many agencies working with business development and workforce training. Their mission is to create family-wage jobs, diversification of the economic base, and the growth, development and retention of business and industry within the [Klickitat](#), Skamania, [Hood River](#), Wasco and [Sherman County](#) area.

It is a grand plan, but many of the pieces are falling into place and things could get rolling once a few pieces are on the ground and working. The airport, which in itself is an asset for the area was upgraded to meet FAA requirements in 2012. Currently 90 percent of the funds needed to operate the airport come from aviation fuel taxes, according to Anderson. If the investment does spark growth, that number could shift and more importantly, jobs and [Economic Development](#) could be in store for a region that is sorely in need.

## John David Caputo

December 3, 1925 –

February 25, 2014

John David Caputo of Murdock, Washington was born in Piermont, New York to Joe and Minnie Caputo on December 3, 1925. He died February 25, 2014. John was the sixth of eight children. He was preceded in death by both mother and father, his brothers Angelo, Lewis (killed in Korea), Tony and sisters Mary and Rose.

When John was seventeen he joined the Navy where he spent his training in Newport, Rhode Island. In 1943 he boarded the famed USS South Dakota where he saw action in World War II. After leaving the Navy for two years he again enlisted and boarded the USS



Pirate which was sunk in North Korea's Wonsan Harbor in 1950. John was injured during this and awarded the Purple Heart. He spent seven months in Bremerton Naval Hospital in Washington. On the LST 855 in South Korea he jumped overboard to save a fellow shipmate and kept him afloat until help arrived. He was awarded the Commendation Medal. He also was in Vietnam teaching wartime procedures where he won the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal. Along with the Purple Heart he was awarded a World War II Victory Medal, Asiatic Pacific Campaign Medal, Korean Service Medal, United Nations Service Medal, Presidential Unit Commendation Ribbon, Philippine Liberation Ribbon and the Republic of Korea Presidential Unit along with others. In 1966 he left the Navy and settled in Toledo, Washington. He belonged to the Operating Engineers, working on rock crushers for the Wallace Brothers Construction in Toledo for six years and Lakeside Industries of Issaquah, Washington for seven years and retired in 1985. In 1979 he married June Sampson and acquired three stepchildren. He called his wife his "beautiful lady" and was extremely happy until her death in August of 2012. John is known for his stories of the Navy and would talk to anyone and everyone. He is survived by his stepdaughters Leatha Carter of White Salmon, Washington and Lorrie Jones of Union, Oregon. He has been well-loved by his surviving brother Joe Caputo of Earlton, New York, his sister Josephine of Arlington, Texas, numerous cousins, nieces and nephews, his stepchildren, his dear neighbors, friends and the many who will recognize him from his photo as the friendly jokester and talker. Great appreciation goes out to Heart of Hospice who took part in the care of John while he was ill. # Code Enforcement Varies Widely From City To County

When it comes to code enforcement, location means everything.

A push to put a shine on Goldendale's curb appeal has been a driving factor in enforcement of city ordinances when it comes to nuisance properties, but it is quite another thing for the county at large.

The City of Goldendale is proactive in contacting residences where nuisances are seen; it is not complaint driven. However, the city council has pressed for action, sometimes on specific sites. In 2012 Goldendale opened cases on 164 properties that were considered nuisances due to accumulation of items deemed to be trash, in the yards. There were 195 cases opened in 2013.

Klickitat County's enforcement of nuisance ordinances is purely complaint driven. In fact, the attitude of the county is much more accepting of trashy locations and the code enforcement department has been known to pass by obvious violators in order to address complaints against nearby locations. It isn't a case of selective enforcement; it is a case of policy.

According to Skip Grimes, director of building and compliance, a more proactive approach would be "very expensive and very alienating." Grimes has been in the department for 26 years and had a hand in developing the current policy which is outlined in Chapter 15.38 Nuisance Abatement ordinance of the county code. He says the current code was developed about 15 years ago. Prior to that there was a lot of neighbor versus

"I think this has worked fairly well," says Grimes, of the current, complaint driven system. "We made it a signed complaint with the identity protected, but it makes people stop and think." Grimes also believes that there isn't adequate budget to seek out violations, saying it would keep more than one person very busy.

The system is "two-pronged," says Grimes. One prong deals with buildings being sited without proper permits. In those cases, the director can initiate an investigation on his own, but also responds to single complaints. There were 42 of those cases opened in 2012 and 62 in 2013.

The other prong is the nuisance property. Nuisance enforcement is strictly complaint driven, according to Grimes. His department must have at least two written complaints. According to the code, the complaints must be from "individual property owners of separate parcels located in Klickitat County within a five mile radius of the nuisance property." There is also a provision for a complaint arising from a "recognized community council." The department opened eight cases in 2012 and six in 2013. Grimes estimates another three to four per year are investigated but don't result in open cases. Grimes assists Joyce DeVries with those investigations.

Once the department receives the complaints they will attempt to contact the property owner and inspect the premises. If the inspector determines that a nuisance exists, the report

will be presented to the Board of County Commissioners who can authorize abatement action. Once a compliance or abatement order has been given, the property owner has 15 days to appeal or 30 days to begin abatement of the problem. If the situation isn't remedied within a reasonable amount of time, determined by the director, the county may proceed to hire work to be done with the cost being assessed to the landowner through their taxes. Grimes says they give every opportunity for people to comply because they don't want to go through the process of abatement. He said there were three cases where the county had a property cleared in 2013 and he believes all or some of those stemmed from cases opened previous to 2013.

The problem of nuisance properties isn't a new one. Grimes says, "It seems slightly cyclic with the economy, but not as much as you might think." Grimes recognizes that many people move into rural areas for some sense of freedom. "Nobody is here to spoil anyone's dreams, ut we all live by a set of rules," says Grimes.
