For Janine "Janey" Brown, this smacks of one of her beloved Aunt Midge's harebrained schemes to bring her out into the real world again, instead of hiding in her tiny apartment, cooking huge, complicated meals so that she doesn't have to face her own personal tragedy. Her reluctance to accept the house is not as strong as Aunt Midge's iron will, so she reluctantly packs up both of them and prepares to move into her new dream home.

Meanwhile, across town, Janine "Nean" Brown is convinced that this house is her destiny. It's an easy decision for her to leave her less than ideal life, with crappy jobs and drunken boyfriends. Dallesport Airport Moves Ahead With Life Flight

A \$1.25 million flex building will be built at the newly developed business park at the Columbia [Gorge](#) Regional Airport in [Dallesport](#) says County Commissioner Dave Sauter. How it will be funded is still to be decided.

Life Flight is expected to take up 30 to 40 percent of the space in the new building. Director of Strategic Planning and Technology, Justin Dillingham says they moved in a trailer for crew quarters in their present location at the airport. They currently lack housing and maintenance facilities to move aircraft indoors during inclement weather. It is a situation that had them considering their options, including moving to another location.

One thing that isn't disputed is that Life Flight is a valuable asset to the area. One way or another, Sauter says the county is committed to build the building. It is important to ensure Life Flight will continue to operate at Dallesport.

Insitu's Eagle Point Facility Grand Opening

A little more than a month following its 20th anniversary, Insitu opened the doors to its new facility on June 12th.

The 127,525-square-foot Eagle Point hosted all manner of Insitu employees, executives from the Boeing Company, and elected officials and their representatives for a ribbon cutting that marked the consolidation of multiple buildings Insitu has leased throughout the Gorge over the years.

With the capacity for up to 180 employees, the facility will serve Insitu's

production needs with office space on the second floor. Jenny Taylor, facilities director for Insitu, spoke at Thursday's event and said by 2009 the company's employees worked in 29 buildings totaling some 300,000 square feet spread across 167 miles throughout the Gorge.

"Our intention is to be more cost efficient and competitive in the (Unmanned Aircraft Systems) market by providing an efficient, sustainable, and technologically advanced facility for our workforce," Taylor said.

Insitu CEO Steve Morrow drew parallels between Insitu and the Boeing Company in his opening remarks, saying that he hopes innovation by the company he's led for the past three years can one day match that of Boeing's.

"We haven't changed the world yet, but we're only 20," Morrow said.

Multiple elected officials, including the Klickitat County Board of Commissioners, state Sen. Curtis King (R-14th District), representatives from Congresswoman Jaime Herrera Beutler's office (R-Wash-ington 3rd), and more were in attendance at Thursday's ceremony, which was held on Eagle Point's vast production floor, complete with a ScanEagle and Integrator on display.

Boeing Vice President and General Manager of Unmanned Airborne Systems Mike Kurth thanked Klickitat County's administration for helping evolve Eagle Point from vision to reality.

"I think we owe a huge debt of gratitude to our elected officials who stood by our progress here and we have some of the most innovative and thoughtful employees on the planet, so I think this partnership between our elected officials, the local community, and the talent that's here is really something special," Kurth said.

With the snip of the ribbon by Morrow on Thursday, Eagle Point opened its doors to its employees and, as Taylor pointed out, a continued era of progress for both the company and Klickitat County as a whole.

"Over the past two decades the Gorge has been focused on reconstructing its economic foundation and industry base to better protect its natural resources and empower its entrepreneurs. According to census data, 10 years ago Klickitat County was one of the most economically distressed regions in Washington. Now in 2014, Klickitat County is one of the highest in the region for per-capita income," Taylor said. "We hope that trend continues and we play a valuable role in shaping the future of our community." *Reprinted with permission from The Goldendale Sentinel.*

Sheriff'S Retirement Announcement Sparks Accusation Of 'Politics'

Klickitat County Sheriff Rick McComas will officially retire from his position on June 30, according to a letter submitted to the Klickitat County Board of Commissioners.

The letter, dated June 3, states that McComas will retire as a "personal choice."

"For no other reason than personal choice related to some ongoing health issues, desire to complete personal projects and prepare for a private employment opportunity I have chosen to retire from my current Sheriff position effective June 30, 2014," McComas wrote.

Klickitat County Commissioner David Sauter said the letter was submitted to the board at their June 3 meeting. McComas leaves his position after 39 years of law enforcement, the past seven of which have been served as sheriff. McComas defeated an elected incumbent to win election in 2006, then ran unopposed for re-election in 2010.

In his letter, McComas states that after meeting with the current sheriff administration he is assured that the department will be left in good hands and said Undersheriff Marc Boardman, who is running for McComas's position in the upcoming election, "has displayed an extraordinary ability to work with the employees and union, other law enforcement agencies and county departments and especially the citizens of Klickitat County."

"There are no complicated projects in place at this time. Future budgetary and/or project plans are well known to the administration and I would foresee a continued positive effort by the administration to address departmental needs with the (Board of County Commissioners)," McComas wrote.

The next Klickitat County Sheriff will be appointed by the Board of County Commissioners after three suggested appointees are named by the Klickitat County Republican Party. The interim sheriff will serve out the remaining 6 months of McComas' unexpired 4-year term.

Klickitat County Republican Party Chairman John Deo said the Central Committee will meet on July 2 at 6:15 p.m. at the Dallesport Community Center to make the decision on which three candidates will be submitted to the Board of County Commissioners.

According to Deo, both Republican candidates currently running to be the next Klickitat County Sheriff, Bob Songer and Boardman, have expressed interest in being interim sheriff, but that might not be the outcome Republican Party members hope for as Deo said some would rather appoint a neutral interim candidate and let the election results make the decision for who will be permanent sheriff.

Calls and e-mails to Boardman seeking comment were not returned prior to this week's press deadline.

Ed Powell, Klickitat County's emergency management director, has also expressed interest in filling the interim sheriff position as that neutral candidate.

"If you think about it this is a difficult position for the commissioners to be in and they shouldn't have to be made to make the decision between two candidates who are running against each other. This will take a little pressure off of them so the playing field can be even for those candidates vying for the position in the election," Powell said.

According to a public notice placed by the Klickitat County Republican Party

requesting applicant resumes for interim sheriff that ran in this week's The Enterprise, appointees must be Criminal Justice Training Commission certified, a requirement that neither Powell nor Songer meets. According to Powell, reinstatement of certification can occur through the Criminal Justice Training Commission, however.

Songer also said he believes the appointee should not be either candidate running for sheriff.

"I'm definitely interested in being sheriff of this county, but as a candidate I've already got my name out to be sheriff, and I stress that in light of what's going on with this campaign the commissioners would be much better off to appoint a third party that doesn't have a horse in the race. Neither Marc nor I should be appointed and instead the commissioners should appoint a third party and let the voters decide," Songer said.

McComas rescinds retirement

Klickitat County Sheriff [Rick McComas](#) announced late Tuesday afternoon that he would not retire early after all.

McComas had told the county commission on June 3 he would retire at the end of June.

Yesterday he submitted a letter to the commissioners saying he had changed his mind.

"After discussing with members of the Republican Party and Chairman Sizemore the inconvenience caused by my announcement and acting pursuant to the requests of both entities," McComas wrote, "I will withdraw my intent to retire."

Find His Killer

The family of **Scott Erlenbush** is facing the second anniversary of his brutal murder in just a few months. They miss him in all aspects of life. Scotty was an important part of his family. He was a son, husband, brother, father, stepfather, uncle and nephew. They all miss him so much, words can't describe the depth of their loss.
