Gun Range Coming To Dallesport

Gun enthusiasts of the Columbia River Gorge will soon have a place to let off some steam—or ammunition. Thanks to the efforts of Klickitat County Commissioner Rex Johnston, Klickitat County Engineer Jeff Hunter, and several others, a gun range will be opening in Dallesport this coming summer.

“This project is one that I’ve been working on since I’ve been a commissioner,” says Johnston. “It’s really something I love being involved in, because there isn’t a gun range anywhere in the Gorge for people to come shoot. We started the process months ago, using the run-off material on Centerville Highway. We’ll be using it as a backdrop for the range.”

The range will meet the National Rifle Association’s standards and will ultimately be 500 yards, but it will be opened as a 50-100 yard range. Johnston says that very little county money will be going into the project (about \$25,000) and that the overall cost will be more than \$1 million. The rest of the money paying for the range is coming from grants received from the Washington State Recreation and Conservation Office. This money will pay for the construction of the range.

According to Johnston, Hunter will be handling the project. “Once the permits are in place, construction begins (a three to six month process). After it’s complete, we’ll be looking for someone to run the range on a daily basis. We hope to have it complete by the end of June,” says Hunter.

“This is a very popular hobby in the county and in addition to this being a public-access range, it’ll also be used for the Goldendale, White Salmon, and Bingen police departments to come train,” says Johnston. Both Johnston and Hunter believe this project will not only benefit the county’s shooters but that it will benefit the county’s economy as well.

“I envision it being a real draw for this county because of things like cowboy shoot-outs, for instance. This could also be really good for tourism,” says Johnston.

“It’ll be a positive thing for the community and attract people to the county, it should be a great place for people to go,” says Hunter.

"The Last Heir" by Bill Greaves took me to gumshoe heaven. Jack MacTaggart is a fast talking, sarcastically funny lawyer who knows his way around a courtroom.

Phillipe Giroux, the patriarch of the Chateau Giroux wine empire, has tragically lost a son. Or has he? Once confirmed by the court, Alain Giroux's death will pave the way for his brother Phil to inherit America's most storied winery. Or will it? Andy Clarkson, Alain's boyhood chum, covets the vineyard acreage for his neighboring golf resort. Or does he? Claudia Giroux, Phillipe's hauntingly beautiful daughter, has proof that Alain's death may not have been all that it seems. Or does she?

As they grapple for control of the California winery, Jack MacTaggart is caught in a cross fire of estrangement, betrayal and murder. Jack learns the hard way that blood may be thicker than water but money is a powerful anticoagulant.

NOTICE OF REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS TO USE KLICKITAT COUNTY HISTORICAL PRESERVATION FUNDS

The Klickitat County Board of Commissioners has discretionary funds, generated by recording fees, which are intended to promote historical preservation or historical programs, which may include preservation of historic documents. Klickitat County is currently seeking proposals for projects to use these funds. The total amount to be awarded in 2015 is \$5,000 with a minimum award per approved applicant of \$500.00 and a maximum award per approved applicant not to exceed \$1,000.

Projects may be to acquire or preserve local historic buildings, artifacts or documents; to develop and present local historical programs or events; or to perform research into local history. Applicants must be non-profit or governmental entities which perform educational, interpretive, or preservative activities within the boundaries of Klickitat County which promotes or preserves the County's local history.

Youth Mental Health First Aid Training!

A young person you know could be experiencing a mental health challenge or crisis. You can help them. You are more likely to encounter someone — friend, family member, student, neighbor, or member of the community — in an emotional or mental crisis than someone having a heart attack. Youth Mental Health First Aid teaches a 5-step action plan to offer initial help to young people showing signs of a mental illness or in a crisis, and connect them with the appropriate professional, peer, social, or self help care. Anyone can take the 8-hour Youth Mental Health First Aid course, but it is ideally designed for adults who work with young people, ages 12-18 — teachers, coaches, leaders of faith communities, social workers, and other caring citizens.

Sometimes, the best first aid is you. Take the course, save a life, strengthen your community.

KLASAC is partnering with Comprehensive Mental Health, the ESD 112, and the Division of Behavioral Health and Recovery to offer two Youth Mental Health First Aid trainings this March in Goldendale and Lyle. This training is for any person who is interested in learning more about the risk factors, warning signs, and mental health challenges faced by today's adolescence as well as gain some tools to deal with these things day-to-day.

Maryhill Museum of Art

Maryhill Museum of Art opens its 75th Anniversary Season **March 15, 2015** with the special exhibition American Indian Painting: Twentieth-Century Masters. The landmark exhibition brings to the Columbia River Gorge a collection of 35 paintings of a type seldom-if ever-exhibited in the Pacific Northwest.

Curated by [Maryhill's](#) Steve Grafe, the exhibition features some of the most important American Indian artists of the 20th century. These artists were residents of the Southern Plains and Southwest, and affiliated with the University of Oklahoma, Bacone College and the studio at the Santa Fe Indian School. Their works were some of the first painted after educators of Native students were allowed to encourage-rather than suppress-Native cultural expressions. Produced largely between 1930 and 1980, the paintings that appear in the exhibition show the later, mature work of these seminal artists.

Artists featured in the exhibition include: Stephen Mopope (Kiowa), Allan Houser (Chiricahua Apache), Fred Beaver (Creek/Seminole), Jerome Tiger (Creek/Seminole), Harrison Begay (Navajo) and Tony Da (San Ildefonso). All of the paintings in the exhibition come from the collection of the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum in Oklahoma City.

In addition to American Indian Painting: Twentieth-Century Masters, the museum will open several more special exhibitions in March 2015. These include:
