Electric Rate Increase

In late 2014, given forward electric sales markets and external factors, we budgeted for a 5% electric rate increase, planned to be effective April 2015. Lately, I have personally attended several community meetings and discussed that budgeted 5% increase, but also discussed that there are no guarantees as to what the future holds for rates. Unfortunately, that is proving to be the case.

Four months can make an incredible difference, good or bad, in a commodities market like electricity. At our April 14th Board meeting, the Commissioners directed staff to set a public electric rate hearing to consider a 9% electric rate increase.

In coming to that conclusion, during that meeting, the Board considered two reports by staff, a Cost of Service Analysis (COSA) study and a financial forecast.

The COSA indicates that for our traditional business service of providing power to our rate payers and keeping the lights on, a 3.6% electric rate increase was warranted. This includes our McNary Hydro generation project, as it supplies approximately 15% of our wholesale power to our customers. This considers a

6.7% BPA cost increase expected October 1, 2015 as well as increases in our materials and services costs. That study also states that our rates are also fair and equitable between the rate classes. PUD staff and the Board concurred. That means electric rate increases will likely be equally applied to each rate class. The Board also concluded that any rate increase be applied to all components of our rates consistently, i.e., the base fee, demand, power factor and other components.

The financial forecast includes everything in our electric business at the PUD, including our retail business, White Creek Wind project, HW Hill landfill gas project and our 230 kV business lines. Future electric market prices have declined significantly. As result, our surplus power sales and the resulting revenues are forecast to be significantly reduced in the future. Prices could get better, or they could get worse. The forecast suggests that we should be increasing retail rates by 9% in order to ensure that we remain financially healthy today, and if we do not take other actions to increase our revenues from other sources or reduce costs, that there is a

potential for future rate increases if market prices do not recover.

This means that 3.6% of the proposed rate increase relates to our Transmission & Distribution systems, and 5.4% is related to the performance of our projects. We have had many years where these projects have contributed to help reduce our retail rates. Between 2003 and 2011 we did not raise electric rates at all. When we did raise rates between 2011 and 2013, the net effect was an average of a 1.9% rate increase per year during the 10 years 2003 through 2013. With the proposed 9% increase, the net annual increase from 2003 until 2015 would be 2.3% over those 12 years. An average \$140 per month residential bill would go to \$153. PUD staff is continuing to actively work on staying within our approved budgets and in evaluating alternative sources of revenues to help with our financials in the coming years.

The public rate hearing is planned for May 12, 2015 at 6:00 P.M. at the PUD's public meeting room, 1313 S. Columbus Avenue, Goldendale WA.

Book Review

The Power of the Dog
by Don Winslow

Don Winslow's masterpiece is not only a page-turning thriller but also a rich and compelling novel about a very mixed group of characters, each in his or her own way seeking some sort of salvation or redemption. The plot is essentially simple: how the US government and some of its quasi-autonomous agencies (CIA, FBI, DEA) all for their own reasons encouraged, sponsored and actively financed and helped the development of the drug cartels and their trade in Mexico. Groups of characters - a young Chicano boy from the Barrio who makes good and becomes a Senator (and who is the target of an assassination plot that tops and tails the book); a morally troubled DEA boss who tries to do good, but who is driven by events and by a desire both for salvation and revenge to sleep with the devil; and the various gang leaders, some of them psychopathic, others urbane, civilised and deadly; a high-class prostitute; and a charismatic Catholic priest who is dedicated to the improvement of the lives of his people.

This is a thundering powerhouse of a book, with a plot that twists and turns in a race to the finish line. Bottom line- the world is a dangerous place and it is filled with brutal people who will stop at nothing to gain power and money. While very graphic and downright violent in places, this is a book that will open your eyes to things we should all be aware of. All is not perfect in paradise.

Columbia Hills Trail Daze

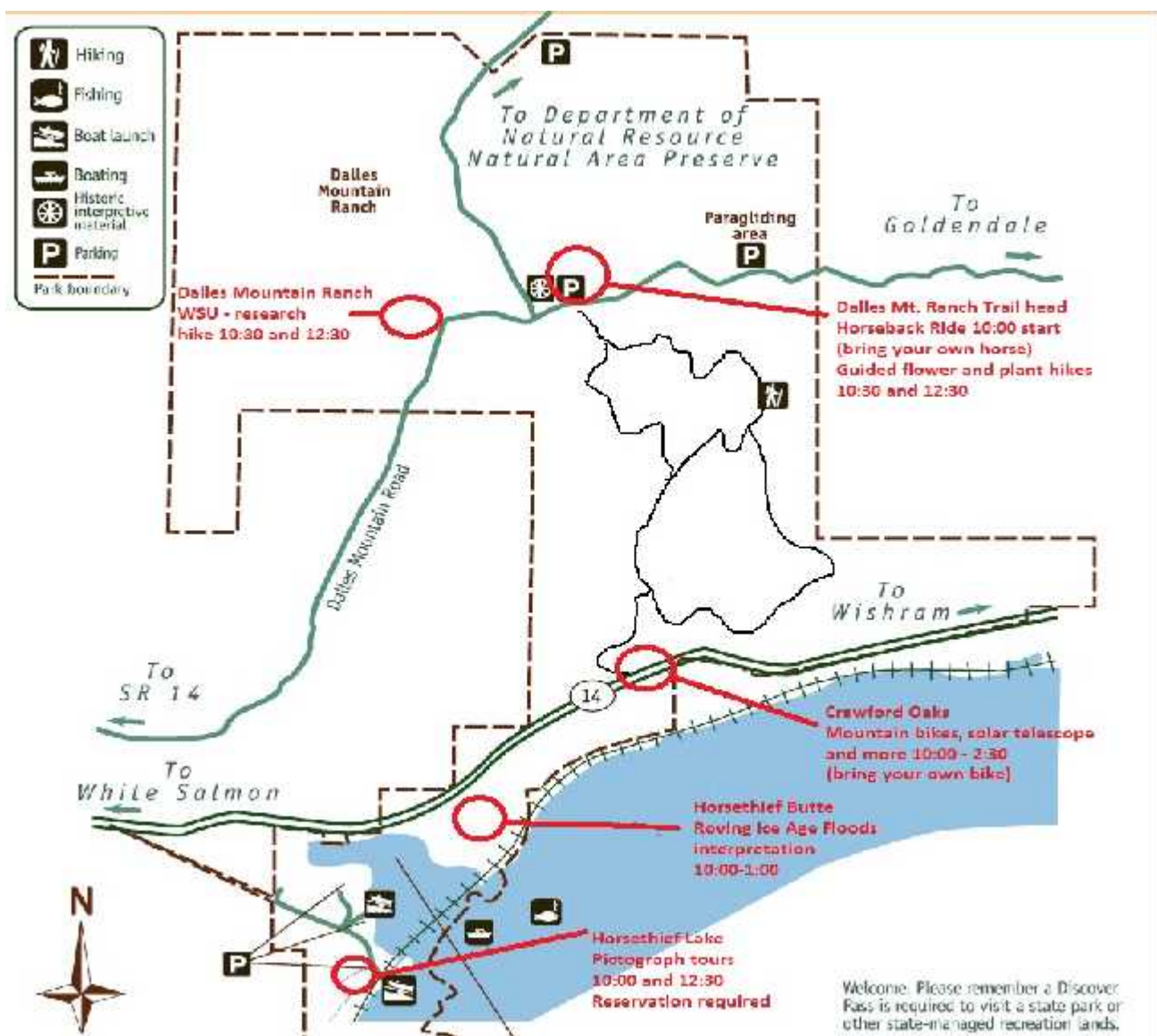
Come celebrate one of the many great parks in the Goldendale Area State Parks. Columbia Hills State Park hosts Columbia Hills Trail Daze on **5/2/2015**, with events scattered around this large parks old and new recreation sites from 10:00 a.m. to around 2:30 pm.

Pictograph tours at Horsethief Lake 10:00 and 12:30, space is limited so book your tour spot now by calling 509-439-9032. Roving Ice Age Floods interpretation at Horsethief Butte from 10 to 1, meet Ryan Karlson, Interpretive Services Program Manager for Washington State Parks to learn how our gorge was scoured by 1000 foot deep floods. Imagine the initial surge wall rushing through the gorge at speeds around 60 mph.

Join Professor Steve Van Vleet from WSU for a hike and discussion about his research permit using livestock to restore native plant populations at Dalles Mountain Ranch at 10:30 and 12:30. If you like plants rotate over to a native plant hike with botanists from Washington's Department of Natural Resources also at 10:30 and 12:30 starting out of the new trail head past the ranch building complex.

If you're into horse back riding, meet up with members of the Mount Adam's Chapter of the Washington Backcountry Horsemen's Association at the ranch trail head for a ride on the new 6+ mile trail system that connects Crawford Oaks and the ranch. Ride kicks off about 10:00 but they often start gathering between 9:00 and 9:30 to offload and saddle up. The trail is open to mountain bikes too so if you haven't checked out your near east alternative to Coyote Wall or Post Canyon then this is a great day to bring your bike out to the new Crawford Oaks trail head on SR 14 and check out the trail.

Look for other presenters at the various park access points that might be hitting things like stream health in 8 Mile Creek, solar telescope viewing of the sun with traveling staff from the Goldendale Observatory (crossing my fingers it's sunny), and more. For more information you can email the park at Columbia.hills@parks.wa.gov or phone the park at 509-767-1159. Reminder: All programs are free you just need a Discover Pass for all of our Washington State Parks or you can purchase a day permit at the various park access points or ahead of time on line at <http://discoverpass.wa.gov/> or where-ever hunting and fishing licenses are sold.

Dallesport Elementary 3rd & 4th Graders want YOU to know the dangers of smoking!

When asked what they could say to a neighbor to convince him or her to quit smoking Dallesport 4th Graders responded:

"I would say hey, did you know smoking pollutes the air and children and animals breathe the air so if you keep smoking then you could be harming people and animals. When you leave the cigarette butts on the ground it could start a fire and did you know 50% of all house fires are caused by cigarettes?!"

"I would say, hey, don't smoke because you'll get bad lungs and cancer. You also can get heart disease. Strokes are really bad and if you smoke you could get that! It will make you die. I don't want these things to happen to you so follow these rules: 1. Don't be that one person who smokes 2. Exercise if you did start to smoke and quit 3. Never ever start to smoke again. Follow these rules and you will be safe."
