A Wedding in Great Neck by Yona Zeldis McDonough

The Silverstein family is coming together in Great Neck, Long Island, for the nuptials of the youngest daughter. Always considered the favorite, and the object of much envy and resentment. Angelica has planned a fairy tale wedding to her fiancé, a former fighter pilot. But there are storm clouds on the horizon. Lyle School Wins Top Honors

A team of students from Lyle School won first place in the Columbia Gorge Wind Challenge on May 2. Prizes include a trophy that will have a place of honor in the school and a full expense paid trip to OMSI for 30 students. In the one day competition, more than 40 teams from the Gorge and Portland competed to build, test and present their wind contraptions. Student teams were rated on strongest mechanical power, fastest speed for transferring kinetic energy, most electrical power generated and making a professional presentation.

The students on the Lyle Team and their science teacher, Donna Sholtis gave up weeks of lunch period and social time. Two senior students, Daniel Bliss team leader and blade designer, and Jacob Zeigler team manager and lead gear box designer,

had participated in previous Wind Challenge competitions and mentored the other students in applying their knowledge of physics and engineering. According to Sholtis, "I am most impressed with my student's ability to mentor one another and their ability to be effective team players. These attributes combined with their knowledge of blade and gear box design won this challenge."

The following roles and specialties were developed on the team; Elizabeth Smith – co- blade designer, Lauren Weddle – co-blade designer, Chawn Baukman- gear box designer, Gage Mattox- alternator assembler, Sebastian Lindinger- magnet assembler, and Jessie Hickman and Josh Showalter as alternates. Not only did students learn about the science of wind generation, but also project management, working as a team, learning through persistence and how to present in a professional manner. To top it off, the Wind Challenge was also the same date as Prom Night! Several of the students juggled hair appointments, and picking up tuxedos while they waited to hear the results of their high tech competition, and then danced into the night! It was a great day for Lyle School and reflects the work and dedication of the school staff, parents and community to support their students.

Jacob Ziegler, team manager, summed it up: "We as a team feel the competition was a very successful event and full of opportunities for educational development. We would highly recommend more schools to participate in this competition and are grateful for our opportunity."

Fire Danger

The fire danger rating on Klickitat County lands protected by the state Department of Natural Resources went from “moderate” to “**high**”

A countywide ban on outdoor burning in areas protected by the DNR and by

local fire districts took effect June 1, per order of the Klickitat County Board of Commissioners. The moratorium began a month earlier than normal because of drought conditions in the County.

The County has been hit with some small fires already this fire season, but those were manageable. Fire chiefs are hoping for less but nothing more. (*The Enterprise*)

Drought and Water Conservation

We can all do our part to lessen the effects of limited water supplies expected this summer. We can start by conserving the water we use today. We must do more to conserve water. **Beginning immediately we must implement the following watering plan. Please water on odd days if your address is odd and even days if your address is even.**

Lawn and Garden:

Outdoor water use accounts for almost half the water used by the American home, and thus provides the greatest single opportunity for conserving.

Water early in the morning before 10:00 a.m. Watering in the heat of the day allows the water to evaporate and watering late in the day may promote fungus and other lawn diseases.

Depending on the weather, it's generally better to water once a week

and provide 1 inch to 1 ½ inches of water. (If it's hot, you might have to water more often.)

Time how long it takes to apply one inch of water by placing a flat-bottomed can about 6-feet away from the sprinkler.

Do not mow lawns too short; taller grass requires less water. Consider letting your lawn brown out. It will come back.

Repair Leaks:

Check faucets and hose connections for leaks. Inspect pipes for pinhole leaks, and leaking joints. A slow drip can waste 15 to 20 gallons a day. Fix it and you will save almost 6,000 gallons a year.

Showers and Baths:

Use low volume showerheads. They are inexpensive and can pay for themselves in water, sewer and energy savings in less than a year. For a five

minute shower they can reduce water usage from some 40 gallons to 12 to 15 gallons.

Toilets:

Flush only when needed. Do not use the toilet as a trash can. Put a water displacement device inside the toilet tank. Check for leaks.

Clothes Washer and Dishwasher:

Do only full loads. Avoid using extra cycles whenever possible. Choose a water-saving model.

Drinking Water:

Keep a container of cool water in the refrigerator instead of running the faucet. Leave the water off when brushing your teeth or shaving.

Garbage Disposal:

Use the sink disposal sparingly.

Car Washing:

Use one of the automatic car washes in The Dalles where they recycle the water.

The Klickitat & Lyle Against Substance Abuse Coalition (KLASAC) would like to thank local retailers, including Canyon Market in Klickitat and the Murdock Mini-Mart, for doing their part to keep our kids safe by restricting youth access to alcohol and checking for identification to ensure that they are never selling to a minor. Our kids tell us that it is easy for them to get alcohol. We are working to change that by

partnering with the Klickitat County Sheriff's Department and Washington State Liquor Control Board to conduct compliance checks and educate retailers, youth, and parents about the consequences associated with underage drinking.

Key areas of the brain are still under construction during the adolescent years, and are more sensitive to the toxic effects of drugs and alcohol. Youth who drink alcohol are more likely to experience problems at school such as failing grades, social problems, legal problems, physical problems, unwanted or unplanned and unprotected sexual activity, disruption of normal development, assault, an increased risk for suicide and homicide, memory problems, abuse of other drugs, change in brain development, alcohol related accidents and death from alcohol poisoning.


Furthermore, Washington State Law states that it is against the law to provide alcohol to a minor and is punishable by a fine of up to \$5,000 and/or a year in jail. Help our kids be the best they can be this summer. Don't allow children to drink in your home or provide alcohol to minors anytime or anywhere. Talk to your kids about alcohol and pay attention to who they are spending time with. Research shows that teens are less likely to use when parents talk to their kids about alcohol.
