"Make Me" by Lee Child

"Why is this town called Mother's Rest?" That's all Reacher wants to know. But no one will tell him. It's a tiny place hidden in a thousand square miles of wheat fields, with a railroad stop, and sullen and watchful people, and a worried woman named Michelle Chang, who mistakes him for someone else: her missing partner in a private investigation she thinks must have started small and then turned lethal.

Reacher has no particular place to go, and all the time in the world to get there, and there's something about Chang . . . so he teams up with her and starts to ask around. He thinks: How bad can this thing be? But before long he's plunged into a desperate race through LA, Chicago, Phoenix, and San Francisco, and through the hidden parts of the internet, up against thugs and assassins every step of the way - right back to where he started, in Mother's Rest, where he must confront the worst nightmare he could imagine.

Walking away would have been easier. But as always, Reacher's rule is: If you want me to stop, you're going to have to make me.

This is one of my all time favorite characters and I wait anxiously for each new book in the series. You don't have to start at the beginning of the series to enjoy these, they each stand alone very well.

Reacher is a straightforward, simple man and his solutions to problems reflect this well.

I think you would all enjoy getting to know Reacher. He's a good man to know.



School Bus Violations Continue Even After Story

CAN YOU TURN?: You're in the blue car coming up to an intersection-let's say High Street and Columbus; you're on High Street turning left onto Columbus. There's a school bus in the right lane of Columbus stopped with its red lights flashing and stop paddle out. Can you legally turn onto Columbus while the bus' lights are flashing?

A story in a recent Sentinel about troubles with drivers violating school bus stop laws generated much response, almost all of it supportive of the bus drivers.

And still some bus drivers report little change.

An anonymous email to The Sentinel on behalf of the bus drivers made a powerful appeal: "The drivers love these kids," it said. "They take their job and the safety of the students very seriously. They just want what's safe for the kids and what the law requires."

The main thing they want other drivers to know is to start slowing down as soon as they see the bus flash its yellow lights. That means the bus is about to stop. Too often a yellow traffic light is interpreted as, speed up, so you can get through the light before it turns red. But for a school bus loading or unloading kids, that's incredibly dangerous.

And for the drivers who pull out past a stopped school bus at a left turn, as shown in the diagram above (and to answer the question in the caption): no, you cannot turn. (*Goldendale Sentinel*)

KLASAC to Participate in “Talk. They Hear You.”: An Underage Drinking Prevention National Campaign for Parents

On Monday, September 28th, 2015, the Klickitat & Lyle Against Substance Abuse Coalition (KLASAC) joined forces with the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) to launch “Talk. They Hear You.” “Talk. They Hear You.” is a national campaign that empowers parents to talk to their children early—as early as 9 years old—about the many risks associated with underage drinking.

The good news is most of our youth, 88% according to the 2014 Healthy Youth Survey, are choosing NOT to drink says Rita Pinchot, Coordinator for KLASAC and Youth Advisor for our local Teens Against Drugs and Alcohol Abuse group (TADAA!). However, we do know that many children who choose to drink do so before the age of 15. The younger children start drinking the more likely they are to experience the consequences of alcohol use including: academic problems, unintended, unwanted and/or unprotected sexual activity, injury or death, and other drug use.

“These young people are our future leaders—our future teachers, mayors, doctors, parents, and entertainers,” said SAMHSA Administrator Pamela S. Hyde. “As our youth and young adults face challenges, we as a community, need to effectively communicate with them in every way possible about the risks of underage drinking so that they have the necessary tools to make healthy and informed choices.

Through “Talk. They Hear You.”, KLASAC is working with parents of children ages 9 to 15 to increase their awareness of the seriousness and pervasiveness of underage drinking and equip them with the knowledge, skills, and confidence to help prevent their children from drinking.

KLASAC will be implementing “Talk. They Hear You” this fall by partnering with our local radio stations to run regular Public Service Announcements, working with local newspapers to share information, posting a Tip of the Week for parents on their Facebook page, sharing information with parents through our local school districts, and hosting a Family Night on Monday, November 9th from 5:30 – 7:30 at Dallesport Elementary School.

“Talk. They Hear You.” provides KLASAC with parent resources and materials to distribute in the community, including the Campaign’s public service announcements (PSAs). These PSAs and materials show parents “seizing the moment” to talk with their kids about alcohol such as while preparing dinner or doing chores. By modeling behaviors, parents can see the many “natural” opportunities for initiating the conversation about alcohol with their children. This year, the Campaign also offers parents a way to practice talking about underage drinking with their children through an interactive, web-based role-play simulation they can use anytime.
