"Devoted in Death"
by J D Robb

It's a new year in New York city, and two star-crossed lovers have just discovered an insatiable appetite...for murder. Lieutenant Eve Dallas has witnessed some grisly crimes in her career and she knows just how dark things can get on the streets. But when a much-loved musician is found dead, Eve soon realizes that his murder is part of a horrifying killing spree, stretching right across the country. Now the killers have reached New York, and they've found themselves another victim. Eve knows she only has a couple of days to save a young girl's life, and to stop the killers before their sadistic games escalate. Eve's husband Roarke is ready to put his brains and his considerable resources behind the search. But even as the couple works closely together, time is running out...

Lieutenant Eve Dallas is larger than life and devoted to justice for the dead. She is tough as nails in a futuristic New York City that is determined to win the battle for evil but she will never allow the dead to be forgotten.

This series is a great read. There are many ongoing characters and each book manages to add one or two new ones. Cop humor abounds and the relationships are wonderfully entertaining. These are probably best read in order but are still enjoyable on their own.

Community Council Corner By Kim McCartney Council Report

At the November Council meeting, Dallesport land development was a topic of discussion. A meeting has been set up with Dave Sauter for December 17, one week after our regular Council meeting. He will discuss the land development in the lots just south of the Post Office along with residential zoning, and firing range issues in Dallesport.

Jack Kincheloe mentioned that the Dallesport Fire Dist. 6 responds to about 70 residential calls in The Dalles each year. Future meeting ideas are having the fire department and/or Red Cross discuss personal and home safety, fish and wildlife agencies discuss fishing regulations in the Columbia basin, and the Port discuss their development.

The Council 2015 elections were to be held at this meeting but were delayed to the December meeting.

Gary Buffum said he would not run for re-election, Jack said he would run for re-election. PJ Sisseck said she would run for election. Kim will work with Renee and Anthony to set up the election for December. Mary Yoneko Migaki, 98, a resident of Dallesport, Wash., passed away on Sunday, November 8, 2015 at her home surrounded by her family.

She was born in Eatonville, Wash., on June 24, 1917, the youngest of four children to Minekichi and Sute (Takahashi) Tamura. She grew up in Troutdale, Ore., and graduated from Gresham High School in 1935 and went to business college for a short time.

Mary and Masashi Migaki were married on February 18, 1940, at The Dalles Congregational Church. They resided in Rowena, Ore., for a short time, then moved to Dallesport, Wash., for 74 years, except during the war they were evacuated to Pinedale, Calif., and then to Tule Lake, Calif. After about 8 months they got jobs in Ontario, Ore. They were allowed to return to their home in Dallesport, Wash., after the war. They raised vegetables and fruit on their truck farm. She retired when the



children planted cherry trees on the farm.

She was a member of Faith Lutheran Church, Columbia Grange 987 and JACL. She attended the senior meals at the Lyle Lions Club every Tuesday. She went mushroom hunting (which was her passion) well into her 90's and loved to go clam digging and traveling. She was an avid spectator of her children and grandchildren's sporting events. She is survived by her daughters, Janet (Walt) Smith, and Rebecca (Dennis) Beeks; her sons, Roger (Delia) Migaki, and Gerry (Annie) Migaki; her grandchildren, Steve (Cary) Smith, Melissa Severson, Debbie (Brian) Tobin, Rick (Tracie) Beeks, Miko (Ray) Hoy, and Tim Migaki, and a step-granddaughter; 15 great-grandchildren; 4 great-great-grandchildren.

A memorial service was held Saturday, November 21, 2015 at 10 a.m. at Spencer, Libby & Powell Funeral Home with Pastor John Westhafer officiating. Honorary pallbearers; Debbie Tobin, Rick Reeks, Steve Smith, Missi Severson, Miko Hoy and Tim Migaki.

Outdoor Burning Regulations

Outdoor burning information according to the Washington State Clean Air Act ([RCW 70.94](#) and [WAC 173-425](#), Outdoor Burning). “Outdoor burning means the combustion of material of any type in an open fire or in an outdoor container without providing for the control of combustion or the control of emission from the combustion.” Ecology regulates all types of outdoor burning (residential, agricultural, special and land clearing) except [silvicultural](#) (forest land) burning which is regulated by the [Washington State Department of Natural Resources](#). It is only legal to burn natural vegetation, but burning should be considered as a last resort as there are alternatives to burning which you should consider, like chipping. Things you should know before you conduct outdoor burning: When and where burning is allowed, only unprocessed natural vegetation may be burned.

Burn barrels are illegal and you could be fined!

Where residential burning is allowed, the burn pile must be less than 10’x10’x3 and you may burn only one pile at a time

Contacting your local fire department or the non-emergency number for Klickitat County Sheriff’s Office.

A water source is needed

Your smoke must not impact your neighbor and you must put out your fire if it does.

The fire should not include materials hauled from another property.

Do not leave your fire unattended.

It is illegal to burn construction and demolition debris.

Fireworks

Fireworks are regulated by the Washington State Fire Marshal through the Washington State Patrol. In the case of Klickitat County, an additional ordinance was developed to limit the discharge of fireworks. For a general understanding:

Fireworks can only be discharged:

July 4th from 9am-11pm

December 31st from 6pm – 1am on January 1st

As with any fire, you may be responsible for the costs of a fire if you are found at fault.

Carbon Monoxide Safety

Often called the invisible killer, carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless gas created when fuels (such as gasoline, wood, coal, natural gas, propane, oil, and methane) burn incompletely. In the home, heating and cooking equipment that burn fuel can be sources of carbon monoxide.

CO alarms should be installed in a central location outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home and in other locations where required by applicable laws, codes or standards. For the best protection, interconnect all CO alarms throughout the home. When one sounds, they all sound.

Follow the manufacturer’s instructions for placement and mounting height.

Choose a CO alarm that has the label of a recognized testing laboratory.

Call your local fire department’s non-emergency number to find out what number to call if the CO alarm sounds.

Test CO alarms at least once a month; replace them according to the manufacturer’s instructions.

If the audible trouble signal sounds, check for low batteries. If the battery is low, replace it. If it still sounds, call the fire department.

If the CO alarm sounds, immediately move to a fresh air location outdoors or by an open window or door. Make sure everyone inside the home is accounted for. Call for help from a fresh air location and stay there until emergency personnel.

If you need to warm a vehicle, remove it from the garage immediately after starting it. Do not run a vehicle or other fueled engine or motor indoors, even if garage doors are open. Make sure the exhaust pipe of a running vehicle is not covered with snow.

During and after a snowstorm, make sure vents for the dryer, furnace, stove, and fireplace are clear of snow build-up.

A generator should be used in a well-ventilated location outdoors away from windows, doors and vent openings.

Gas or charcoal grills can produce CO — only use outside.

Tips For Driving Safely In Winter Weather

The change of seasons emphasizes the importance of driving with care. Here are a few tips to stay safely on the road:

- Before beginning any trip, check the current road conditions and weather forecast. For statewide highway information 24 hours a day checkout the state’s Department of Transportation website, [www.wsdot.wa.gov](#).

AAA recommends the following winter driving tips:

Avoid driving while you’re fatigued. Getting the proper amount of rest before taking on winter weather tasks reduces driving risks.

Never warm up a vehicle in an enclosed area, such as a garage.

Make certain your tires are properly inflated.

Never mix radial tires with other tire types.

Keep your gas tank at least half full to avoid gas line freeze-up.

If possible, avoid using your parking brake in cold, rainy and snowy weather.

Do not use cruise control when driving on any slippery surface (wet, ice, sand).

Always look and steer where you want to go.

Use your seat belt every time you get into your vehicle.

Flu Vaccine

The CDC recommends everyone aged 6 months and older should receive an annual influenza (flu) vaccination, especially those with chronic medical conditions, those who are pregnant, and those

There is not a shortage of flu vaccine this year: All clinics and pharmacies in Wasco, Sherman and Gilliam Counties report having flu vaccine in stock.

There may be a charge for the vaccine and it’s often covered by insurance.

Contact your primary care provider, clinic or pharmacy for more information and to make an appointment.

Many accept walk-in clients as well.

The North Central Public Health District also has flu vaccine available for children that have coverage through the Oregon Health Plan, or have no insurance.

Vaccine is available to them during walk-in clinic hours two days each week, from 1 to 4:30 p.m. on Wednesdays and Thursdays.



