Chess Sets In The Spotlight As Maryhill Re-Opens For Season

When Maryhill Museum of Art opened its doors earlier this month, visitors were greeted with several special exhibitions, as well as a significant reinstallation of the museum's beloved chess collection.

Relocated with new interpretation and better accessibility, the George E. Muehleck Jr. Gallery of International Chess Sets is giving visitors a fresh perspective on this popular exhibit. There are 80 sets and numerous gaming pieces drawn from the museum's extensive collection, as well as a global historical overview of chess, stories of chess, and chess-related works of art.

"Our goal in moving the gallery was to give the exhibition more breathing room and a more visitor-friendly space," says museum director Colleen Schafroth.

"You can get a much better view of the incredible detail in the sets, and the new cases offer easy viewing by people of all sizes, especially young people," she added.

Funding for the reconfiguration of the George E. Muehleck Jr. Gallery of International Chess Sets was made possible by an anonymous donor, says Schafroth.

Chess has a long history at Maryhill, going back to an early director, Clifford Dolph, who first curated a chess exhibition in 1957; the exhibition proved so popular with visitors that it was extended twice and the museum began collecting chess-related materials.

Over the years the permanent exhibit has become an icon of Maryhill. Visitors of all ages are captivated by the intricate designs, unusual materials, and numerous stories found within each set, drawn from around the world.

The exhibit features sets and pieces from all corners of the globe, including India, Europe, South America, Africa, and Asia.

The gallery is named for George E. Muehleck Jr., a native of New York

City who moved to St. Helens, Oregon as a young physician. Dr. Muehleck was a long-time admirer of Maryhill Museum's chess set collection and a fervent player himself.

He played with anyone who was willing to challenge him and enjoyed playing multiple matches simultaneously with other enthusiasts from around the world—sending and receiving moves through the mail. One such game was followed by a trip to the Soviet Union to visit an opponent he had befriended.

Visitors to the museum can challenge one another to a friendly game of chess using the museum's large-scale chess set in the adjacent M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust Education Center.

Community Council Corner

At the March meeting Andrew Kelly, Lyle School District Superintendent, spoke about the upcoming tax levy.

The levy, to be voted on in April 2016, will last 6 years and will fund capital improvements for the school buildings and laptops for each student in the school district. Mr. Kelly promised to make annual statements and updates on the levy results to the Council. Public meetings were scheduled in March to explain the levy and its purposes.

Mr. Kelly presented documents related to the upcoming school levy. The first document answered the question: Why is a levy needed?

Systems and structures are not in place to keep up with routine maintenance. The HVAC system alone costs about \$37,000 in annual upkeep. The units themselves are aging out, and will soon need to be replaced. But at this point, upkeep remains less expensive than rebuilding.

Because of low funding, programs being sought by many students and parents are not offered. Approximately 150 students living within Lyle School District boundaries are currently attending school elsewhere, mostly in White Salmon. There is room within the current facilities to accommodate those students, and perhaps 100 more, if only there was some reason for them to return.

The second document, designed as a power-point presentation, illustrates how much the levy would cost property owners, and how those funds would be used. This includes a plan to issue laptop computers to each student in grades three through twelve. Lap-tops can be justified on several levels: Students are more engaged with electronic devices than with books; the workplaces of tomorrow likely demand computer literacy; and in the long run, laptops are less expensive and more up-to-date than textbooks (and weigh less, too).

A discussion ensued about state funding of school districts, and why it costs more per student to run a smaller school. The simple answer is that costs per square foot of facility runs the same whether a few students or many students are using said facility.

Airport Manager Rolf Anderson was in attendance, and was asked for an update on how things are progressing at the airport and the industrial park. Points made included:

No written agreements are in place for the long-rumored golf course.

A new production facility is in the works for Everybody's Brewery. Life Flight is preparing to lease 15,000 square feet of building space.

More hangers are being planned in configurations of eleven per building. There is currently a waiting list for sixteen units, so probably two buildings will be erected.

Overall, flights using the airport are up by 40% from last year.

Northwest Motor Sports has a plan to use a closed runway for motorcycle training courses.

A four-day conference of Flint Nappers is coming up.

A certified flight school is in the works. It is planned that the Veterans Administration may fund classes for Veterans.

The Experimental Aviation Association is now recruiting high school students who have an interest in aviation careers. The National Guard has been utilizing the airport for refueling stops, particularly when the weather over the Cascades forces longer than usual flights.

The annual Fly-In is coming up the third Saturday of June. Proceeds from this event go toward the Fire Department Building Fund.

A restaurant business opportunity is available at no cost for the lease of space.

Please join us for the next Council meeting on **April 14th** at the Dallesport Community Center. At 7pm.

Klickitat PUD will provide their annual update, and discuss the water-wastewater systems.

Dear Lyle School District Families,

It's been a busy school year filled with many successes. We have opened a preschool, brought reading and math scores up, have visited colleges, scheduled regular professional development days, rethought grades and discipline, partnered with families and community members and cheered on our girls volleyball and basketball teams at the state tournaments. On April 26, you will have an opportunity to vote on a ballot measure that was approved by the school board last month to

fund technology and capital projects for Lyle School District. Putting a computer into the hands of each student in grades 3-12 makes sense at school and will allow them to extend their learning by using the devices at home as well. Taking exceptional care of the physical plants at Dallesport Elementary and the Secondary School is the best way to honor the fiscal investment that our community has already made in support of our kids.


These projects will cost 3.3 million dollars, according to an outside review that was conducted to support our planning. If you want to find out more about exactly what the costs are, please check the

district website. There's a lot to do! In order to raise these funds, we will need to levy property taxes for an additional \$1.76 per thousand on top of the \$2.76 per thousand for our maintenance and operations levy for a new combined tax rate of \$4.52 per thousand.

Ballots will be mailed on April 8 and must be returned by April 26.
