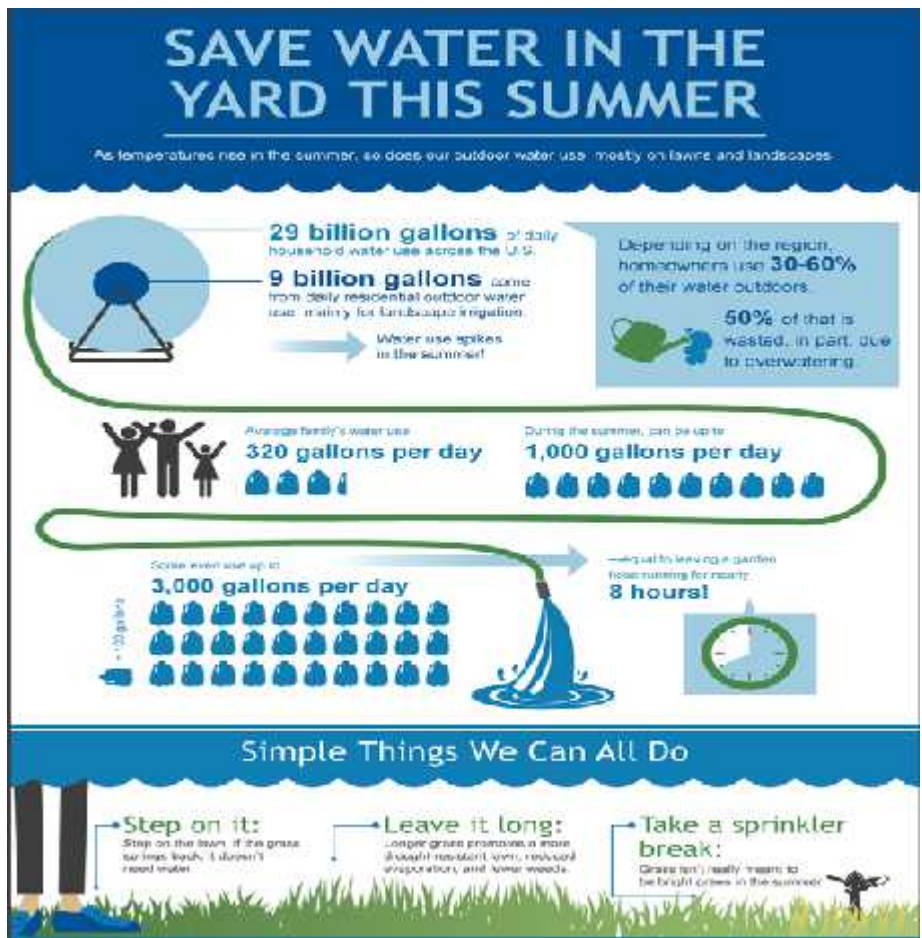

# Skyline, Northshore Reach Verbal Sales Agreement

## Hospital board authorizes purchase of medical group's buildings and lease-back to clinic

The board of commissioners for Skyline Hospital unanimously passed a resolution last Wednesday, May 11, authorizing the Hospital District's chief executive officer to execute a real estate purchase agreement to buy the NorthShore Medical Group buildings located at 212 Skyline Dr.

NorthShore Medical Group will draft the purchase and sales agreement within the coming weeks, while Skyline Hospital writes a lease agreement to lease the property back to the medical group until its new office is completed. Skyline Hospital and North-Shore Medical Group representatives reached a verbal agreement of \$750,000 for the property, which includes two modular offices and two site built medical offices. Skyline commissioned an appraisal of the NorthShore property by Dean Potter & Associates, Inc. which valued the property at \$775,000.

Skyline Hospital CEO Robb Kimmes will be reviewing the purchase agreement currently being drafted by NorthShore Medical Group. Kimmes doesn't know when the deal will close, "Hope-fully we will have a better idea of the timeframe next week."

The purpose of the resolution authorized Kimmes to pursue a real estate and conditional sales agreement, which allows Kimmes to move forward with the purchase of the property, and directs Kimmes to acquire appropriate legal review of the real estate purchase agreement upon completion.

NorthShore will eventually move in to its new facility, a proposed single story 15,500-square-foot professional office space, located off State Route 14 and east of the Bridge RV Park and Campground.

Skyline plans on transferring its business office functions to North-Shore's buildings as well as "other departments that don't need to be located in the hospital," Kimmes explained. This move will allow the hospital to expand, and create more room for growing patient care services in the main hospital building, Kimmes said.

"We will also be looking in to the possibility of moving our outpatient physical therapy services into one of

the buildings to have those services closer to the hospital," explained Kimmes, "and to allow more space for physical therapy services."

Skyline will use a combination of funds from its operating cash flow and reserves to purchase North-Shore's buildings, explained Sky-line Hospital CFO Brenda Schneider. If the hospital is able to stay on budget this year, no financial problems are anticipated.

The money NorthShore obtains from the purchase will be directly rolled over to fund the development of the medical group's new facility. In the meantime, North-Shore will continue to reside in the buildings at 212 Skyline Dr. and rent the spaces back from Skyline.

The hospital anticipates renting the property back to NorthShore for \$100,000 a year, according to Sky-line's appraisal report, or \$12 per square foot of the net rentable area of 8,345 square feet.

"They're in agreement for a fair market value lease, at the rate in the appraisal," Schneider said.

The lease won't need board approval once its finished.

## Skyline Hospital Expands Transitional Care

In support of an overall plan to meet the needs of the Columbia River Gorge community today and in the future, Skyline Hospital has expanded its transitional care program.

"Transitional care is a high quality, evidence-based program for patients who are well enough to leave a traditional hospital setting but still have nursing, therapy, or respiratory needs that may not be optimally met in their homes or long term care," explained Chief Nursing Officer Stefanie Boen, R.N. "Some examples of these needs would include frequent intravenous medications, wound care, breathing treatments or intensive physical, occupational, or speech therapy."

Skyline has partnered with Allevant Solutions, a joint venture of Mayo Clinic and Select Medical, to help develop its new program. Modeled on the Mayo Clinic's successful efforts in Wisconsin and Minnesota, and created by Mayo Clinic pulmonologist and

Allevant Medical Director, Mark Lindsay, M.D., the program is designed to provide access to high quality post-acute services in rural America, which are persistently underserved.

"While most patients with post-acute needs receive their care in a long-term care environment, these facilities are often not equipped to provide optimal post-acute care for more complex patients," said Dr. Lindsay of Mayo. "As a result, patients and families in many rural areas have to either settle for less-than-ideal settings or travel."

Over the past year the Skyline staff have been implementing new processes and participating in Allevant's clinical education. Most patients receiving this care at Skyline will be covered by the Medicare SNF (Swing Bed) reimbursement program, and other insurers may participate as well.

"As the nation's population ages, there will be an increasing need for facilities with the expertise and capability to care for patients with medically complex conditions, especially in our rural communities," added Boen of Skyline.

"By enhancing our ability to provide this care, we are not only meeting the post-acute care needs of current and future patients, but also providing increased stability and excellent employment opportunities for our community as a whole," he said.

Robb Kimmes, CEO of Skyline, said "in addition to local patients being able to return to the gorge after receiving care at larger facilities in the Portland/Vancouver Metro areas, we anticipate our program will attract patients from other communities who prefer to receive their post-acute care at Skyline due to our record of quality, our team model of care, and the conveniences offered by our small town setting."

"Because we have full choice over how many transitional care patients to admit at any given time, we will be able to guarantee the program will not limit our ability to take care of the day-to-day needs of our local patients," Kimmes added. "This is a win for our patients, our employees and our community."

## Two-Day Sturgeon Catch-And-Keep

Anglers will have a very brief chance to catch and keep sturgeon in Bonneville Pool of the Columbia River.

Fishing will be open **June 18 and July 1 only**, and white sturgeon must measure between 38 inches and 54 inches fork length.

The open section of the Columbia and adjacent tributaries are from Bonneville Dam up to the sturgeon spawning sanctuary boundary located 1.8 miles below The Dalles Dam, from the east (upstream) dock at the Port of The Dalles boat ramp straight across to a boundary marker on the Washington shore.
