NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Klickitat County Planning Commission will hold a public hearing **July 18, 2016 at 7:00 p.m.** in the Klickitat County Courthouse, Commissioners Meeting Room, 205 S. Columbus, Goldendale, WA.

THE PURPOSE of said hearing is to hear all interested parties who wish to testify for or against the following proposal:

REZONE ZON2016-01: Applicant: William Maley; Representative: Tenneson Engineering Corporation.

The proposal is (to be considered per Section 2.23:2 of the Zoning Ordinance which allows a rezone to be considered per a "resolution of intent to rezone" which moves to ensure the public health, safety and welfare will be best served) to rezone Block C of the original Plat of Dallesport dated June 4, 1946, including an approximate 8.46 acre parcel owned by William Maley and 26 individual lots encompassing the whole of Block C from Suburban Residential (SR -20,000 square feet lot size) to Two-Family Residential District (R-2 -6,000 square feet minimum lot size for single family residence; 7,000 square feet minimum lot size for two-family structure). The rezoning will facilitate the consideration of a Long Subdivision of Mr. Maley's 8.46 acres into 19 6,000 - 7,000 sq feet lots and remainder parent parcel for a total of 20 lots. The proposed project is located within a portion of Section 33, T2N, R13E, W.M., Klickitat County, WA.

The Planning Commission may make recommendation to the Board of County Commissioners to approve, deny, approve with conditions, table, or continue the matter to a set time and place.

The application is available for review at the Klickitat County Planning Department, 228 W. Main St., Goldendale, WA.

Bringing Our Children Together

Why is Lyle School District talking about consolidating our schools into one building?

We have half as many children as we had in 1998; we receive about \$1.7 million less today than we would if we still had 450 students. We also currently receive a \$230,000 School Improvement Grant which will end after the 2016school vear. Our current operating budget leaves us with about a 1% ending fund balance, making it impossible to grow music, art, STEM, AP and other pro-grams, and which leaves us no money to address emergencies or the \$3 million in necessary repairs that the Levy that failed this spring would have addressed. Once the SIG grant expires, we cannot keep operating the district as it is.

If elementary students attend the secondary campus, where will they go? Will they be separated from high schoolers?

There are enough empty classrooms in the secondary campus, that with just a few moves, can easily place each elementary grade in its own classroom. Primary grades (Pre-K, Kindergarten, first, second, third) would have their own hall with their own bathroom. Intermediate grades (fourth, fifth and sixth) would be clustered together and will have their own bathrooms. Middle and high school classes would be clustered together and will have a separate bathroom. Elementary and secondary students would have separate passing times.

Would the teacher-to-student ratio or class size change?

No. We would retain the current class structure for elementary classes with one teacher and one para-educator working together to team teach each grade level. Each grade level, PreK-6 will have its own classroom.

Where would the elementary students play?

If the school board decides to consolidate, the district would erect a play structure in a fenced area, and create a space ideal for four-square, wall ball, and tether ball, which would also be a fenced area that would be off-limits to secondary students.

What would happen to the Pre-K program?

The Cougar Kittens and all their wonderful classroom materials would move with us! They'll be in the primary grades hall that has a bathroom and main entrance that won't be used by secondary students. Depending on family transportation needs, there may be buses that take students home or to Dallesport after school.

What would happen to the Dallesport building?

We would seek to rent or lease the building out to cover the costs of maintaining the building.

What would the district do with the savings?

We would begin building programs back in, such as increased music,

arts, CTE, and/or STEM classes. The district would work to create an ending fund balance of 5-8% of the total budget, which is important to the ongoing fiscal health of our district and our ability to continue growing pro-gram offerings. We would also begin to address the \$3 million in deferred maintenance the Capital Levy that failed in April would have addressed.

How much would the district save by consolidating the schools?

We would realize about \$171,883 in reductions in force plus \$52,316 in utilities and maintenance costs for a total savings of about \$224,199 annually.

Can we keep kids in two separate physical plants and offer them the most efficient education?

No. Short of a significant tax increase to our community or substantial growth in student enrollment, we'll never be able to offer the equitable programs our students deserve. Consolidation is the most effective solution to allow us to offer high-quality education from Pre K through twelfth grade, grow opportunities for kids and prepare all students for career and/or college.

Would there be more or different buses?

We would partner with our community members and our transportation department to make sure students are transported to school as safely, quickly, and comfortably as we can.

Update by Tria Bullard

On Thursday, June 9, the school board met at Dallesport Elementary. Superintendent Andrew Kelly recommended consolidation to the school board at this meeting.

The Board voted 3-2 in favor of moving forward with preparing a budget that reflects consolidation and the loss of 16 FTE (from where we are now).

We couldn't formally vote on consolidation because we discovered a state law that says that if a district is going to "close" a school building they have to follow a certain process, including preparing a formal report and not voting until 90 days after the first hearing. So our official vote regarding consolidation will occur at our August 18th meeting.

By voting to direct Superintendent Kelly to prepare a budget based on consolidation, it allows him to move forward with consolidation preparations, including convening a prek-5 parent meeting to discuss the transition, letting staff know, moving classrooms, etc. The vote on the 18th will be more like a formality with all of the pieces for consolidation already having been put into place.

Lyle Elementary Students Show Tremendous Growth

Lyle, WA June 9, 2016

During the 2015-16 school year, Lyle Schools have implemented many reforms, which, according to state testing data, have paid off. Elementary cohorts in tested grades saw gains on both the English Language Arts and Math Smarter Balance test of double-digit percentage points over their cohort's previous year's scores.

Fourth grade students' proficiency in both ELA and math in 2015-16 is an astonishing <u>22</u> percentage points higher than it was for the same cohort of students when they were in third grade in 2014-15. These students demonstrated proficiency in ELA and math at very nearly the state average for fourth grade for 2015-16.

Fifth grade students scored $\underline{28}$ percentage more proficient in math and $\underline{12}$ percentage points more proficient in ELA this year than they did as fourth graders in 2014-15.

Second grade does not test, so we do not have cohort data for this year's third graders as compared to previous scores, but they scored <u>15</u> percentage points higher in ELA and Math this year than last year's third graders.

These gains can be attributed to the skilled teaching staff of the elementary students, who are all partnered with a para-educator so all ELA and math curriculum is team taught using a combination of whole and small group instruction. Elementary teachers also adopted a common curriculum to use for ELA this year, CTB McGraw Hill's *Wonders* curriculum. They are also in their second year of using Eureka Math as a common math curriculum.

State Superintendent candidate, Erin Jones, who visited Lyle earlier this year, when she learned of the turnaround in progress had this to say, "Turning schools around is not about changing students but about changing that behaviors and beliefs of the adults working with students. Sometimes all it takes is giving staff common language, tools and the opportunity to collaborate and realize no one is in this work alone.

We're super proud of the progress of our amazing 3, 4, 5th graders! Considering Lyle was previously in the lowest 5% of performing schools in WA state....this growth is amazing and exactly what we expected and our kids deserve! Andrew Kelly
