"The Marauders" by Tom Casper

When the BP oil spill devastates the Gulf Coast, those who made a living by shrimping find themselves in dire straits. For the oddballs and lowlifes who inhabit the sleepy, working-class bayou town of Jeannette, these desperate circumstances serve as the catalyst that pushes them to enact whatever risky schemes they can dream up to reverse their fortunes. At the center of it all is Gus Lindquist, a pill-addicted, one-armed treasure hunter obsessed with finding the lost treasure of pirate Jean Lafitte.

His quest brings him into contact with a wide array of memorable characters, ranging from a couple of small-time criminal potheads prone to hysterical banter to the smooth-talking oil-company middleman out to bamboozle his own mother to some drug-smuggling psychopath twins to a young man estranged from his father since his mother died in Hurricane Katrina. As the story progresses, these characters find themselves on a collision course with each other, and as the tension and action ramp up, it becomes clear that not all of them will survive these events.

Sharon Carter, Director of Klickitat Senior Services, spoke on the services available to senior citizens within the county. These include meals, transportation, in-home health care, and energy assistance grants.

Discussion on the proposed Maley subdivision showed the attendees overwhelmingly opposed to the plans as presented. A group effort to attend the public hearing before the County Planning Board was organized, with many committing to attend the meeting in Goldendale scheduled for 18 July.



1920-2016

Donald Eugene was born to Cecil and Vida (Griesel) Graves April 5th, 1920, in Randolph, Nebraska. He passed away Friday, July 8, 2016, in his home in Dallesport, Washington, surrounded by family.

Don's parents moved their family to Yakima, Washington when Don was about 6 years of age.

Don enlisted in the Army Air Corps in July 1941. He served in Texas as a flight engineer in the glider pilot training during World War II.

When Don returned from the service he worked as a foreman for the Yakima Sheep Co. in Lyle, Washington until the sheds closed.

He married Betty Lou Dewalt June 16, 1949 and they began their family. They moved from Lyle, WA to Dallesport, WA in 1958.

Don worked for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers at The Dalles Dam before taking a job with Bonneville Power Administration and working there for over 25 years.

He planted a test plot of grapes in 1969 with the guidance of Dr. Walter Clore from Washington State University. With the results of the varieties that thrived in Dallesport's climate, he planted his vineyard. Don tended his vineyard until his passing.

Friends and family called Don by many names, Dad, Grandpa, Sir Dodgenald and Chief to a few honored men in his life. Don's family was the light of his life. He loved nothing more than to gather around his table and enjoy a meal full of laughter, stories and wine with friends and family. He will be greatly missed, but always cherished in the memories of those he loved. He made sure to instill in his family the value of hard work, humor, table manners, honesty and that there isn't anything a little snort of cough syrup can't cure.

Don was predeceased by his son, Gregory Graves. He is survived by his wife, Betty Lou Graves; and children, Douglas Graves; Kip Graves and his wife, Julie; Robin Urness and her husband, Timothy; Tami Toth and her husband, Andrew.

Thanks to Ms. Marvel and Ms. Kilian, we launched a new pre-kindergarten program that will ensure that even more of our kindergartners start school ready for success!

Congratulations to 4th grade teacher, Lori Smith and secondary mathematics teacher, John Bister, who both are still in the running for Washington State Teacher of the Year! These two educators are great examples of the kind of amazing teachers that we have in Lyle.

So appreciative of our K-5 staff who embraced a new instructional strategy and operated as a blended teaching team, one certificated and one classified staff member, to ensure that we have low class sizes to adult ratios and that each of our kids get exactly what they need...whether that is enrichment or remediation.

Our K-6 teachers implemented a new ELA and Math curriculum this year ensuring that our kids are exposed to a rigorous curriculum aligned to the Washington State Learning Standards.

Congratulations to our 19 high school graduates from the class of 2016 and each of the adults who worked tirelessly to support them for at least 13 years. Your persistence and grit will serve you well in the future.

Our district is undergoing significant transition this summer by unifying our entire Pre K to 12 student body under a single roof at the Lyle Campus. Though this transition presents challenges, it also opens opportunities to continue to meet the needs of each of our kids in new and innovative ways.

Lyle kids deserve an excellent educational experience in a school where every classroom is filled with an effective teacher and classified staff. Our kids deserve a trajectory that sets them up for high school graduation and life after....college, careers, and a successful life as a contributing citizen!

Public Tax Supported Hospitals & How That Pertains To Skyline Hospital

The two most common types of hospitals are tax supported public hospitals and private not-for-profit hospitals. Skyline is a tax supported public hospital that was created around 1950 by a vote of the taxpayers in western Klickitat County. The need for a community hospital was identified and the community agreed to help support the maintenance and operations of the hospital through property taxes, a model common in rural communities around the country. Washington State currently has 42 public district hospitals receiving taxpayer support. Skyline actually receives less in annual taxpayer support than most of the other Washington public district hospitals.

Skyline Hospital is owned by the residents of the hospital district. No individual makes a profit from the operations of Skyline. Any profits

generated are invested back into the hospital to maintain and improve the health care services provided to the community. The \$480,000 in taxpayer support is also invested back into the hospital to maintain and improve the facilities, to replace aging medical equipment and to implement new services such as our recently developed Community Health and Wellness Program.

Skyline is restricted to what the tax levy funds can be used for and there are also many other state laws and regulations public hospitals must comply with that do not apply to private not-for-profit hospitals. Skyline receives periodic accountability audits by the Washington State Auditor's Office to monitor our compliance. Skyline's next accountability audit will take place in a couple months.

Profit margins for many rural hospitals (public and private) are very slim, and a lot of rural hospitals are currently operating at a loss. Taxpayer support helps ensure that quality health care services will continue to be available and easily accessible to the residents and visitors of western Klickitat County. Please be assured that Skyline Hospital is a good steward of the tax levy funds it receives, and uses the funds wisely and appropriately. We are working hard to develop a strong and financially stable health care organization that will be here many years into the future.

On an additional note, Skyline Hospital is a key economic driver in Klickitat County and The Gorge by employing almost 150 people and generating an annual payroll over \$10,000,000.
