The hugely popular **Gorge Fruit & Craft Fair**, presented by Griffith Motors, arrives Saturday and Sunday, October 15-16, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., at the Hood River County Fairgrounds, 3020 Wy'east Rd., near the community of Odell. It's an autumn favorite! **Admission and parking are free.**

Celebrating the people and products of the Columbia River Gorge — and only the Columbia Gorge — the Gorge Fruit & Craft Fair features arts and crafts, gourmet food products, fresh Hood River fruit, flowers, baked goods, local wines, jewelry, furniture, plants and flowers, soft goods, and much more — all grown, made or crafted in four Oregon and Washington counties of the central Columbia River Gorge.

The Gorge Fruit & Craft Fair is well known throughout the Northwest for serving up a relaxed atmosphere of country fun for everyone in the family.

The Hood River County Fair Board organizes the event.

In addition to the wide selection of products and creations offered by Gorge exhibitors, the 2016 Gorge Fruit & Craft Fair features a full slate of special activities.

The Odell Garden Club holds its annual autumn flower show and sale in the Floral Building throughout the weekend. The Hood River Art Club presents a large gallery-style art show and sale. Find fresh local fruit. Try delicious Gorge wines. Savor tasty food, including barbeque by the FFA, favorites from the fair kitchen, and other tasty treats. Special Olympics will be holding a fundraiser for their important work. Enjoy live music by the Gorge Strings Sunday afternoon.

Fruit & Craft Fair attendees will have a special opportunity on Saturday. Just steps away from the fair, in the fairgrounds arena, a Ranch Sorting competition will be taking place. It's a Western-style equestrian sport in which two riders work together—and against the clock—to cut the correct cattle from a herd and drive them into a pen. In case of rain, look for it in the big livestock barn. It's great fun to watch! Admission is free.

The Gorge Fruit & Craft Fair is one of the special Harvest Weekend events and observances

taking place throughout the Hood River Valley the third weekend in October. Allow plenty of time to tour the valley and enjoy all of events. It's the perfect way to welcome autumn.

Those wishing to spend the whole weekend enjoying the Gorge Fruit & Craft Fair, and all of the other beauty and attractions of autumn in the Hood River Valley, may want to camp at the park-like rural fairgrounds. Camping and R.V. sites are available, which include electricity and access to a dump station.

To reach the Hood River County Fairgrounds near the community of Odell, south of the city of Hood River, drive I-84 to Hood River exit 64, then travel south on State Highway 35 to the Odell junction. Follow the signs to the nearby fairgrounds at 3020 Wy'east Rd., at the intersection of Wy'east and Summit roads. Or drive Highway 26 around Mt. Hood to its intersection with Highway 35, then north to Odell.

## Book Report

### "Until Tuesday: A Wounded Warrior and the Golden Retriever Who Saved Him"

by Luis Carlos Montalvan

Luis Montalvan was a dedicated, decorated soldier who saw hard duty in Afghanistan and the Middle East. He was wounded badly enough to become a disabled veteran and came home to New York to continue his college education and to rehabilitate himself.

He discovered that the Veterans Administration and their policies made his PTSD even worse, instead of helping him to learn to cope and lead a more normal life. He had constant pain from his injuries, he couldn't sleep without drinking himself into a stupor, riding the subway to classes brought out the worst of his anxiety and he became withdrawn and reclusive. He didn't like to be around other people and found it hard to interact with others.

At that time, veterans like him (he wasn't blind but he was still disabled) weren't put with service dogs. He was in one of the first groups of veterans who got into a program that matched them with dogs that helped each vet with their personal challenges and traumas.

He was matched with a big, goofy Golden Retriever named Tuesday, who eventually became his best friend and his savior by helping him live a more normal, interactive life.

Luis graduated college and has become a tireless advocate of the Wounded Warriors who struggle to get the Veterans Administration to give them the medical and mental health help that they earned and deserve. He has written articles that have raised questions about how the war was run. He has hounded the military to improve the treatment of all disabled vets and refused to back down when he hits a wall.

I found his observations on the politicizing of the military and how politics, not battlefield strategy, is what moves how America fights war in the present day. He has been criticized for being too outspoken for the comfort of the Brass in Washington D.C. but he hasn't let them slow him down.

This was a wonderful book on a couple of levels, one being you just root for this guy all through the book and two, it doesn't sugarcoat anything.

He was there. He lived it. He tells you what hell it was. And he tells you how much it hurt when the organization he had dedicated his life to so he could live his dream of protecting his country, let him down again and again.

I hope you read this book. It will change how you look at our freedoms in this country today.

## Community Council Corner By PJ Sisseck & Renee Briggs

Guest speaker for the Council Meeting on 8 September was Pat Arnold, who is running as an Independent for County Commission in District 1. Her theme is "moving forward together", with goals including economic development (as in locally owned businesses in farm and forestry). Ms. Arnold is also interested in preservation of farm land (as in limiting further building on lands suitable for farming) and protecting natural resources from degradation. She is concerned about affordable housing, directed growth, and emergency planning before disasters occur. Another stated goal: Stop fighting with the Yakama Tribe!

A County Commissioners' Meeting on 13 September was attended by six Community Council members, and about twenty others of the Dallesport community. Rather than send the application for William Maley's proposed development in Dallesport to the Planning Board (which failed to reach a recommendation on the project), the County Commissioners scheduled a Public Hearing in Dallesport. This hearing will be **11 October, 6:30 PM**, at the Community Center. Testimony from the Public will be permitted.

We would like to welcome Bill Morris who volunteered and was appointed as our temporary Council member. He is filling in the seat that was vacated by Art Mengert who resigned this past June. Bill will be running for this position in the November 10<sup>th</sup> election.

There will be three Council positions open for election next month. Elaine Kincheloe will be up for re-election. Bill Morris's temporary position is open. Renee Briggs is resigning and her position is open. Raymond Clough will be running for that position, but if you are interested in joining the Dallesport Council please submit your letter of intention to Dallesport Community Council P.O. Box 8 Dallesport, WA 98617. You may also contact Kim McCartney at 509-594-6195 or Anthony Rizzi at 541-980-4515 or attend the October 13<sup>th</sup>, Council meeting.

## Dallesport Residents Force Another Hearing.

A large group of Dallesport - Murdock homeowners and residents drove to Goldendale to attend the Board of County Commissioners meeting on 9-13-2016.

With two of the Commissioners in attendance, Jim Sizemore and David Sauter, the REZONE application, ZON2016-01, from Bill Maley was deferred for another hearing. This BOCC hearing will be held **October 11, 2016 at the Dallesport Community Center at 6:30 p.m.**, (136 6th Ave.) This will be an official hearing where testimony can be given.

At stake is the future of our community. The Bill Maley plan if approved will forever change the nature of our community by placing high density, duplex housing on Block C. Also at stake is forced higher taxation for current Block C homeowners, as the rezone application requires all lots and land in Block C be rezoned in order not to violate Washington State Law.

The Dallesport Community Council has voted unanimously to oppose this rezone application. I urge all residents to attend this hearing and help put a stop to high density housing in rural unincorporated Dallesport. I want to thank all the residents of Dallesport and Murdock for the support and encouragement provided during our campaign.

# Lyle Senior, Philip Kilian, Completes Internship at Insitu

Lyle Community Schools offers our students opportunities to "learn by doing." Senior Philip Kilian completed a summer internship at Insitu. Below is his reflection! Congrats Philip! Wishing you an amazing senior year and transition to college! Mr. K

Hi, I'm Philip Kilian, and I am a Senior at Lyle High School. I would like to share with you the experience I had during my summer internship at Insitu. Insitu is an international company that manufactures unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV drones) and provides services operating these drones for customers, with a variety of different applications (both commercial and military). This summer, I had the opportunity to work as an IT (Information Technology) intern at Insitu, Inc. in Bingen, Washington. During my time at Insitu, I was exposed to the friendly, diverse, and hard-working culture of the company (which also happens to be a wholly-owned subsidiary of Boeing).

This summer, I was based out of the Eagle Point facility, which is their largest office building in Bingen, as well as one of their main manufacturing locations. Every day, I assisted and worked alongside a diverse workforce from many different departments, as well as from many different parts of the world. I also made several intern friends this summer, many from east coast technical colleges, as well as some from the northwest. Becoming acquainted with such a diverse group of people was a very vital part of my internship, as their stories were an eye-opening extension of my learning experience and opportunity given to me

by Insitu as well as the staff at the Lyle School District. This just goes to show how Insitu is an international organization, with connections all over the globe.

As an IT intern, I spent most of my time either in the Eagle Point server room working on laptop repairs and preparations for new hires, or setting up workstations for those new hires throughout the Eagle Point building, as well as their office buildings on the main street of Bingen, and their office located at the Waucoma Center in Hood River, Oregon. I worked alongside a very qualified and hardworking group in the IT department, including my mentors who did a great job at giving me any help along the way, as well as providing me with the tools and knowledge to complete each task to the best of my ability.

While there many tasks for me to do at my everyday job at Eagle Point, being an intern at Insitu also came with a variety of events and activities open to the many interns throughout the company. Among the events I participated in include a trip to Arlington, Oregon to watch a flight of their ScanEagle drone, which included both a launch and recovery of the UAV. Operators at the Arlington site also demonstrated the surveillance imaging capabilities of the drone, being controlled from inside a rapid response vehicle/truck. Even at low operating altitudes, the drone was very hard to spot in the clear skies that day. Another intern activity was a group intern project, where (approximately) ~50



executives. I was a part of group 10, the high school intern group. Since our group was the only high school team against nine college intern groups, I guess you could say we were the underdogs. While we prepared our presentations very late, my group advanced to the final three groups, which presented to several top executives within Insitu. While we didn't place first, the fact that we (as high school underdogs) made it that far with little preparation was very satisfying, as well as a great opportunity to meet top dogs at Insitu.

Overall, I had a very good experience interning at Insitu. The entire workforce was very friendly, cooperative, hardworking, and approachable. I am very fortunate to get the opportunity to work at a great company such as Insitu all summer long. I would like to thank my science teacher Mrs. Sholtis with approaching me about this opportunity and giving me a letter of recommendation, secretary Mrs. Machado and superintendent Mr. Kelly for getting us in contact with Insitu's intern department, as well as math teacher Mr. Bister for giving me another letter of recommendation. I greatly appreciate the support and opportunity given to me by the staff at Lyle School District. This was a great extension of my education this summer, and an opportunity I will not take for granted.

In the most recent Dallesport news, Mr. McDermott, shared in his opinion piece the following-

“Recently, we voted down a levy which had the effect of closing the Dallesport Elementary School. Although I sincerely hope that the money can be found to re-open Dallesport Elementary soon, the fact is that the children raised in the proposed subdivision will have a reduced access to an already strained education system.”

I just wanted to shoot a quick response to the points that he suggested. I respect the voters in Lyle tremendously. The special levy on 4.26.16 that our voters did not approve was a levy for capital needs, deferred maintenance that hadn't been completed on both the Lyle Campus and the Dallesport Campus. It also included a small amount, relatively (300K of a 3.3 million levy) to provide our kids 1:1 computers, like many kids across our state/nation have.

When I accepted the superintendency in July of 2015 there were two main challenges; 1) the academic performance of our kids in Lyle and 2) the fiscal instability of the district....that has existed for years due to declining enrollment, historic double-levy failure in the last decade, etc.

The decision to unify our campuses in Lyle was made because it allows us to improve both of the above areas.

During the 2015-16 school year, both campuses had between 6-7 empty classrooms that sat vacant....

I understand the concern of Dallesport citizens around the housing proposal....just want you to know that our interest in the district is to provide a top notch education for each child in our district, in excellent facilities with quality teachers.

I wouldn't classify Lyle School District as a “strained education system.” My description of our district would be a good district that is rapidly becoming great by using our resources wisely, working to develop positive relationships with all of our communities, and adding both supports for kids who are struggling and expanding course offerings to further enrich our kids.....Since July, 2015, we've added pre-school, a CTE (career technology education) teacher, full-time music teacher, increasing art and adding drama. We have reasonable class sizes and have restructured many of our classrooms to provide both a certificated and classified colleague working shoulder to shoulder on behalf of our kids.
