"The Night Crew"

by Brian Haig

Lieutenant Colonel Sean Drummond, a cocky US Army lawyer who's not afraid to be blunt, finds himself up to his neck in a case he didn't ask to take. Five US soldiers, tasked with guarding Iraqi prisoners, stand accused of committing depraved atrocities against their charges. Drummond is assigned to defend one of them: a hardscrabble young woman who is either incredibly naive or deceptively evil...and whose incriminating photos made the case an international scandal. Drummond and his co-counsel, the fiercely antiwar Katherine Carlson, have a complicated and combative history, but they can't afford to get distracted now. They must determine what drove five young patriots to fall so far to the dark side of human nature. As Drummond uncovers evidence that his client has been used as a pawn in a secret strategy involving torture, he realizes that he's caught up in a conspiracy that reaches the highest levels of government. Breaking down the US military's formidable stonewalling could destabilize the government and put his life at risk-but Drummond's not the type to back away from a good fight.

Sense of Place The Paradox of the Cascade Tribes

For decades people have assumed that the Cascades tribes were sent away to reservations and are part of reservation communities. This historical paradox has vexed historians for generations because it appears that for many Cascades people, they did not remove nor are part of reservation communities. Join Gorge Owned as they welcome David Lewis for a Sense of Place Lecture that will explore new research about the history of the Cascades Tribes, what happened to various tribal divisions, the role of the federal Indian Agents, the role of the United States military, the events leading up to and following the attack on the settler Cascades community in 1856, and the effects of this history on many of today's descendants. Lewis is a Tribal anthropologist, a member of the Grand Ronde Tribe, and holds a PhD from the University of Oregon. Over the past decade he has worked to understand in greater detail what happened to the tribes of Oregon during the settlement period and what happened to them after removal to Tribal Reservations. David teaches at regional colleges and lives in Salem with his wife Donna, and his sons Saghaley and Inatye. Doors open at 6:30 p.m., and the lecture begins at 7 p.m. Come early to enjoy a glass of wine or beer and meet others in the community. Gorge Owned's (GO!) Sense of Place is an annual lecture series that seeks to foster a deeper understanding of and connection to our landscape and to one another. State Sets New Voter Registration Record

Washington has set a new one-day record for voter registrations.

MyVote.wa.gov, our main voter information and registration tool, was jammed with online business on Sunday, spiking after the presidential debate last evening. The new record is 23,167, far exceeding the previous one-day record of 13,109 that we set

recently with a big assist from Facebook and Google.

The state celebrated its four millionth voter in April and of Monday morning, the number is 4,194,673.

Midnight tonight, the 10th, is the online registration deadline. Mail-in ballots are also due today, but counties will honor an Oct. 11 postmark, since today is a federal holiday and no postmark is available for either today or yesterday.

It will take several days for counties to process the registrations they receive both online and by mail. Auditors' offices are open for walk-ins today, and will accept new in-person registrations through Oct. 31.

"We are delighted with the new record number of registered voters being set every single day," said Secretary of State Kim Wyman. "Sunday's surge was nothing short of amazing, and it looks certain that we'll have a robust turnout. That level of voter engagement is so good for self-government. We need to hear all voices."

Voters' Pamphlets – 33 zoned editions—are being mailed to 3.3 million households this week and ballots will go out next week, starting Wednesday in most locales. Military and overseas voters – 72k—have been able to vote for weeks.

Dental Plans Soon Available Through Washington Healthplanfinder

Starting Nov. 1, customers can shop new 2017 dental plans through Washington Healthplanfinder.

Who can enroll

Dental plans can cover just adults, adults and children, or children only. Anyone who is eligible and enrolls in a Qualified Health Plan is eligible to enroll in a dental plan. You'll get to decide which household members you'd like to cover as you shop.

Households can only sign up for one dental plan. If the household is eligible for tax credits, it will only be applied to the health plan, not the dental plan.

Shopping for dental

You can shop for dental plans the same way you pick a health plan – sort, filter, and compare options side-by-side. You can also view your total monthly costs for both health and dental before you confirm your coverage.

Pediatric dental

Dental coverage for children is an essential health benefit, which means any child on your application who is 18 or younger is required to enroll in a dental plan.

Dental plans for children are available through Washington Healthplanfinder as family plans or as pediatric-only plans. Benefits for children don't differ between family plans or pediatric-only plans. The only difference is that with family dental plans, all members of your household (including adults) can be covered.

Things to consider when enrolling your child in a pediatric-only dental plan: Pediatric-only dental plans are not necessarily cheaper than dental coverage that covers the entire family. Plans and prices are different for each insurance company. Compare your options to make sure you pick the right coverage for your family.

If your child is eligible for Washington Apple Health, you don't need to enroll them in a separate dental plan.

Because dental coverage for children 18 or younger is considered an essential health benefit, an annual out-of-pocket maximum applies to any dental plan your child is enrolled in. Dental is not an essential health benefit for adults so the same annual out-of-pocket maximum does not apply.

Washington Apple Health and Dental. Dental is included under Washington Apple Health coverage for both adults and children. Once you're enrolled in Apple Health, you don't need to purchase a separate dental plan. Learn more about Washington Apple Health dental cover
