Klickitat Co. Denies Dallesport Rezone Plans Developer Has Right To Appeal Or Submit Revised Plan, Following County's Decision

Citing safety concerns, the Klickitat County Board of Commissioners voted 2-0 in Goldendale on Tuesday to deny a rezoning application on a residential parcel in Dallesport.

Developer Bill Maley, a longtime resident of Klickitat County and The Dalles area, wanted a zoning change for the parcel known as "Block C" so he could switch it from suburban residential (SR) zoning with single-family 20,000-square-foot minimum lot sizes, to R2 multi-family zoning with 6,000-square-foot lot sizes for single family homes or 7,000-square-foot two-family lots.

Plans denied

Commissioners voted against a rezone plan that would have allowed an extra 22 houses to be built on a parcel in Dallesport. The project, which provoked controversy, got a "no" from the commission due to safety concerns. The developer can now appeal the decision.

The rezoning would have allowed an additional 22 houses to be built on the parcel.

"We really felt there were significant public safety concerns, particularly by the fire department, for development at that density," said County Commission Chair David Sauter.

"We have no ability to modify the proposal; it was either an up or down vote, and we felt the safety concerns could not be adequately mitigated." Sauter and Commissioner Jim Sizemore voted against the proposal; Commissioner Rex Johnston was absent due to illness.

The proposal had sparked strong controversy in the community.

In July, the Dallesport Community Council voted unanimously to oppose the rezoning, and last month the commissioners came to Dallesport to hear directly from the public regarding the proposed rezoning.

Fire safety became a primary concern, and the Dallesport Fire Department expressed opposition to the plan to build higher density housing in Block C, which is bordered by Third Avenue to the south, Sixth Avenue to the north, and Central Boulevard to the west.

"The problem we see here is, high density for us is a huge risk," Darren Lacock, Dallesport's assistant fire chief, told the commissioners at last month's public hearing on the topic. "This is too much for our department to handle."

"We don't have sufficient fire coverage for this kind of density,"

said Bill Morris, one of the leaders of the effort to stop the project.

"We refuse to put ourselves and other residents of Klickitat County in harm's way."

Sauter said Maley could appeal the commissioners' decision to Klickitat County Superior Court if he believed the commissioners acted improperly in deciding the case.

"Or he could resubmit a new proposal to address the concerns," Sauter added. "He always has that option."

Sauter said he would like to see more residential housing built in Dallesport, citing the county's infrastructure improvements and a recent study that showed the community would need another 30 housing units over the next 10 years to keep up with projected growth.

Morris said he believes the Dallesport community's opposition to the plan was critical in the county's decision to deny the rezoning plan.

"This has shown what a community can do, and how much we care about livability," Morris said.

Maley declined to comment on the county's decision to deny his rezoning proposal.

'Celebrate The West' Contest Now Open For Students

The Western Governors' Association is proud to announce the second year of Celebrate the West, a regional art competition that challenges high school students to create works inspired by their state.

The inaugural year of the competition attracted hundreds of entries from the 19 WGA member states, as well as American Samoa and Guam. The artwork was displayed at the WGA Annual Meeting in Jackson, Wyoming, and several winners subsequently had a chance to meet the governors of their respective states.

competition. Entrants will create original two-dimensional artwork inspired by their state or informed by living in the West. Students may draw ideas from a variety of sources, including state history, landmarks, natural resources, National Parks and Monuments, people, communities, and culture.

The visual arts challenge, sponsored by the Western Governors' Foundation, is open to high school students in the 19 Western states and three U.S.-flag islands served by the nonpartisan policy association. (Complete list of states below.)

Winning artists will receive cash prizes and their works will be displayed at an upcoming WGA Governors' meeting, as well as on the WGA website. In brief, here's how "Celebrate the West" will work:

- Students will submit a digital copy of their entry via email by April 30, 2017. (Entries may be scanned, a digital photo, etc.). WGA staff and Denver area art experts will select "Finalists" from states and flag islands, as well as a Grand Prize, Second Place, and Third Place winners. The Grand Prize award is \$1,000, the Second Place prize is \$500, and Third Place will be awarded \$300. The remaining state finalists will be awarded \$200 each.

- Finalists will be displayed at an upcoming Western Governors' Association meeting. At the meeting, a Best of Show award will be determined by a vote of meeting attendees, which include governors and their staff, U.S. Cabinet members, and WGA sponsors. Students may also have the opportunity to have their artwork displayed in their home state's capitol building and meet with their governor. This is subject to scheduling and availability, so may not be available to all students.

"Celebrate the West" is open to high school students from Alaska, American Samoa, Arizona, California, Colorado, Guam, Hawaii, Idaho, Kansas, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Northern Mariana Islands, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, Texas, Utah, Washington, Wyoming.

Community Council Corner

Community Council Report for 10 November 2016

Council Chair Don McDermott expressed thanks to the community for coming forward with their opinions of the proposed Maley sub-division. Kudos to Bill Morris for his tireless efforts in research of development and zoning regulations.

Because of our success in this action, several surrounding communities have asked for advice and assistance in forming their own councils. A motion was made and passed to form an association of Community Councils "to work in cooperation with other Community Councils to develop plans specific to individual communities".

Rolf Anderson, Airport Manager, responded to questions. The summer of 2016 firefighting and re-supply base was involved in the suppression of 21 fires over the season, some of those in Oregon. The contract with DNR reaches out four more years. Thought is being given to installing an RV park or "tiny houses" for the firefighters temporarily based in our community. More than enough clients have already expressed interest in leasing hangar space, so another unit is in the works. All office space at the airport is currently full. Visibility for flying purposes is acceptable about 350 days per year, calculated over ten years of recorded data. Our local Flying School has received FAA approval for both private and commercial licenses, with commercial training payable through the Veterans Administration.

The election for Council positions was held. Elaine Kincheloe retained her seat on the Council, W.J. "Bill" Morris will continue in the position he was earlier appointed to, and Darren Lacock fills the vacated position.

Tria Bullard, member of the Lyle School Board, filled us in on what is happening with the former school building. An organic food testing company is leasing the cafeteria area, a soccer association is using the gym part-time, and negotiations are underway with several educational institutions for possible Adult Education opportunities. A Replacement Levy for the Lyle School District will be on the ballot in February.

Speakers at the December 8th meeting will be Andrew Kelly, School Superintendent & Rita Pinchot, KLASAC.

City Hears Outcries Against Nestlé

So many people showed up at the Goldendale City Council meeting Monday night that the council adjourned to the church across the street so the estimated 125 to 150 people would have room to all sit down. They were there primarily opposed to the city having anything to do with the Swiss corporation Nestlé, which has caused controversy in Cascade Locks over a proposal to locate a water bottling plant there.

Some 35 people commented, mostly against Mayor Mike Canon's request to have the council concur with him writing a letter to Nestlé asking them to explore the possibility of such a plant at Goldendale.

One of the strongest voices at the meeting was that of Ethan Jones, attorney for the Confederated Tribes and Bands of the Yakama Nation. "Nestlé wants to tap into the cool water that acts as a lifeline for the Columbia River's fisheries," he said. "In July of 2015, water temperatures in the Columbia River consistently topped 70 degrees, which killed over 100,000 fish, in July alone...Taken together, threats to water are threats of genocide to

Yakama culture and way of life... We've opposed Nestlé facilities in Cascade Locks and Waitsburg, and we will do whatever it takes to stop a Nestlé facility from being built in Goldendale."

Though others spoke in favor of investigating the possibility of 40-50 new jobs and an increased tax base from a \$50 million plant, the council decided in the end to do a great deal more research, including the possibility of looking at other bottling companies, before sending any letter of invitation.

The marathon meeting had to be extended three times, finally concluding at 10:15 p.m.

As the fire trucks near your house please lock your dogs up, have your porch lights on and if possible wait for the volunteers at your door or leave any donations on your porch.


